Committee gives advice on buying toys for Canadian tots

Canadians spend many millions of dollars each year on toys-much of it unwiselybecause shoppers are not as informed about toys as they are about food and clothing.

The Canadian Toy Testing Council, began as a committee of the Citizens' Committee on Children (Ottawa), the National Industrial Design Committee and Consumer Association of Canada, but in 1960, for practical reasons, decided to set up as an independent organization. In the many years of, its existence it has tested many hundreds of toys.

The very abundance of playthings has confused consumers and made toy selection difficult. The results of the C.T.T.C. have been a real guide to parents, educators, retailers and manufacturers, and especially to the child has it been of service, by interpreting his play needs.

When shopping for table games, select those which fit the child's interest and ability; cames that may encourage participation by the whole family; games that offer quiet play for the child who can't sit

Look for adequate size of board with wide spaces; adequate size of accessories; and ability to intrigue and teach.

Look for ease in assembling and taking apart, versatility, balance and steadmess of the finished article.

Wheel toys have the lighest play value when used as accessories with other playthings. Quantity is a factor. Try to supply a variety of smaller inexpensive cars along with a few higger and better ones. By adding accessories (cars, animals, etc.) basic playthings, like unit blocks, take on new life.

Wind-up mechanism makes toys costly. They usually break after a few hours of use, then the child either gets bored or frustrated with the toy and out of sheer curiosity may take the thing apart to see why it doesn't work. Don't mistake this for destruction.

Large dump trucks as a whole, encourage development in constructive, dramatic, physical and social areas. Look for ease m wheeling backwards and forwards, ease in manipulation, efficiency in dumping device. finish and lack of sharp edges and ability to withstand weathering. Play value in all trucks is high.

Manufacturers have moved away from the dolls that chip and break. The preschooler needs the simple vinyl doll, with moulded or short hair, of medium size, 12 to 18 inches. with pliable limbs for easy dressing and complete washability is desired. As the gulgrows older she will want and can manage bigger dolls with more detail and fussy clothes. She will want matching sets to complete costumes.

Some older girls like to collect miniature dolls of many lands and professions with their accompanying costumes.

Girls who learn what is good design in doll houses usually become discriminating home-owners. There is a real need for good doll houses for girls between the ages of 5 and the teens.

A few requisites for a good doll house are ease of assembling, sturdy and well balanced when assembled, room sizes in right proportion to one another, overall design should be simple and attractive Play value of doll houses is enhanced by using them from the roof rather than from one wall.

Doll furniture should be compact, light, easily cleaned and simple, should have balance and steadiness and be realistic.

Intant toys are designed to stimulate the developing senses. The C.T.T.C. test these toys for bright colors, pleasant sound, suitable weight, shape, texture and washability. For safety sake the C.T.T.C. recommends buyers to check for smooth tinish. firmly attached eyes, squeakers, bells, etc., non-allergic. non-inflamable materials, durable joints, seams and moveable parts.

All toys are not tested. therefore before you buy the following may help shoppers select un-tested toys What are the child's play

needs now What toys will meet those

Is the cost in proportion to the estimated life of the toy? -Are they designed with use

Gathering and preparing pine cones for the holiday season can be fun! Pine cones are popular around the house and useful for ndoor Christmas decorations.

with shellac from an aerosol can. The shellac, in addition to preserving the cones, helps keep them looking bright.


