Esquising council

Engineer explains extra cost of road work on 8th line

Esquising councillors questioned an account for over \$500 added to road expenditures for rebuilding the Eighth Line in the bottom end of the township.

D. J. Tefft of J. M. Tomlinson and Associates was grilled regarding the extra cost involved at the regular meeting of the township council, Monday night.

Mr. Tefft said a heavy rain storm in the latter part of November had caused havoc with the project which had been completed about 10 days. Sod had been laid but it had not quite enough root. Water lifted it and carried sod down the ditches. The sod clogged the culverts and washed some culverts out.

Mr. Tefft said a quick decision had to be made. He contacted the contractor and they had rectified most of the damage in one day before dropping temperatures made the job

impossible. The job included a larger culvert.

Asked by deputy-reeve Tom Hill if the job had been with the Ontario government if extra payment would be made, Mr. Tefft replied in the affirmative. The sod had been pegged, he assured the deputy-reeve.

"Wouldn't you normally wait?" asked councillor Ken Marshall, "to see if the contractor's insurance would pay."

"No, replied Mr. Tefft, "not on that type of job after it is approved."

The deputy-reeve said he was against paying the extra, as did Councillor Marshall but both later agreed they had no choice in the matter. The engineer admitted to council that he was surprised at the amount of water which flowed in that area.

Mr. Tefft also discussed the road program with council.

Correspondence at the meeting included a letter from Georgetown mayor W. Emerson requesting a meeting with Esquising and Acton councils to discuss boundaries for the proposed regional government. The mayor also suggested the meeting should be in the Esquising council chambers.

Council decided the date suggested, Thursday, Feb. 6, was not suitable and suggested an alternate date on Tuesday, Feb. 11. However, no decision was made.

A letter was received from a Glen Williams resident, Jack Lowin complaining of dogs running loose in the Glen. Council will ask the dogcatcher to appear at the next meeting to discuss an arrangement.


