Two consolation crowns for Acton in Four Town Tournament

Milton and Georgetown entrants each took home two consolation trophies from the annual Four Town Tournament held in Milton Arena Saturday.

Milton claimed top honors in the Pee Wee and Bantam series, and had finalist contenders in the Novice and Midget classes, both of which were won by Georgetown.

Acton entrants were held to two consolation wins in the Novice and Pee Wee divisions, while Georgetown captured the consolation laurels in the Bantam division. Fergus, the fourth entrant, emerged winless from the day's activity.

Convener Herb Higgs, who headed up a hard-working staff of Milton Minor Hockey Association workers in hosting the all-day tourney, judged it a huge success when the day's 13 games were over.

The crowd and gate receipts surpassed all previous records.

Advance ticket sales had a lot to do with the excellent attendance, and top salaried in each town were each presented with a watch for their efforts. Brett Legate of Acton was the best salesman, going through 49 books. Jeff Foran of Milton sold 45, Bill Bradley of Georgetown 37, and David Graham of Fergus 35. Admission tickets were also good for the draw on a portable stereo phono set, won by Tony van Leeuwen of Georgetown.

During the noon hour, the Rebekah Lodge served delicious hot roast beef dinners to the players at the I.O.O.F. Hall.

Referee-in-chief Glenn Dance supervised the officiating staff and reports only minimal problems. Just one player was banished with a misconduct.

Referees, who all worked the games without remuneration, included Gary Maszles and Barry Inasco from Acton, Gerry Perkins and Mike Bowden from Georgetown, and Murray McConnell, Leon Stickle, Gord Hasselhoff, Gary Nayler, Ted Hood, Trevor Houston, Bert Dancocks and Wayne Timbers from Milton.

Acton Novices won the consolation crown from Fergus after being defeated 4-1 by Georgetown. The lone Acton

goal was bagged by Gord Toth. The Acton team dominated play in the first period but missed several scoring opportunities against Georgetown.

In one of the most exciting games of the series, the Acton team dumped Fergus 4-2. Ed Ensing, Marvin McNabb, Gord Toth and Len Brown scored for Acton. Fred Allen and Bob Anderson assisted.

Milton blanked Acton 3-0 in the first Pee Wee encounter as Jeff Smith scored twice and Ron Rowley once. However, the Acton club trounced Fergus 9-0 in the consolation championship series. Tom Milne got the shut out in goal.

Mike Ferguson scored two goals and collected as many assists for Acton with Pete Hargrave, John Hansen, Kevin Marcoux, Charlie McRae, Bill McKenzie, Wayne Allan and Bernice Taylor bagging one each. Charlie McRae was tops in the assist department with three. Steve Brunelle and Wayne Allan each had two while Pete Hargrave and Kevin Marcoux marked up one each.

Acton Bantams rolled to a 4-1 victory over Fergus in the first game as Bob Krul scored twice and Garth Taylor and Henry Toebes notched one each.

The Acton club made it to the finals against Milton but lost a 5-1 decision in a blood and thunder game which the officials had to clamp down on hard.

John Jordan got the lone Acton goal.

Acton representative Ted Pope who's been busy arranging exhibitions for the Acton teams this season, saw the climax of his work Saturday as all three Acton teams did well. Acton did not have an entry in the midget series.
