
Custodian Jack Harris approached council with complaints of Acton and Georgetown residents dumping parbage along the roads and dragging in old care during the

To the Editor: Do the citizens of this town and community realize the Victorian Order of Nurses (V.O.N.) give home nursing care that which the Public Health

Nurses are not required to do? "Working with the family physician, the V.O.N. provides nursing care at home. The V.O. Nurse visits daily or less frequently, depending on the needs of the patient and on doctor's instructions. She is available to anyone ill at home in a community where there is a V.O.N. branch.

The fee is based on the cost of the visit. No patient is refused service because of inability to pay."
