Acton-Osprege Speedway Campbell kept coming wins feature Sunday

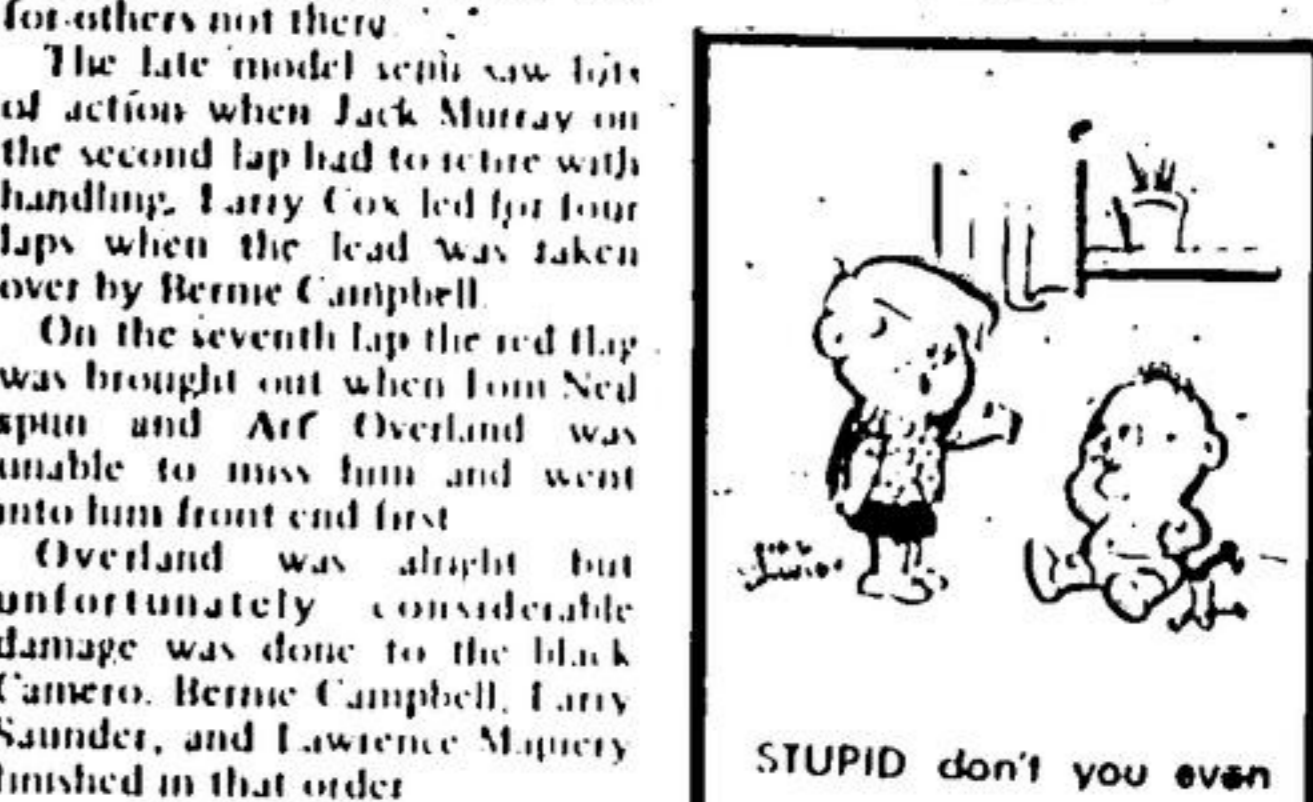
