Juves dump St. Kitt's twice tackle Fergus in playoffs

All summer Acton Indusmin juvenile coach Howard Dwyer had hardly tried to conceal the fact that his squad would like to tackle arch-rival Fergus in the league playoffs. Consequently, when the "hustle town" lads knocked off St. Catharines Kiwanis Athletics and created the mathematical possibility of Acton finishing second and getting a shot at Fergus, the locals grabbed the opportunity.

Friday night Indusmins dumped St. Kitt's 11-8, here, in the replay of the 13-13 tie the two teams battled to in June, then Monday night in Burlington they shaded "the Garden City" crew 16-14 in a sudden death game to decide second place. The juves will now face Fergus instead of Clarkson in the first round of the playoffs. The winner will meet the winner of the Long Branch-Dixie series for

the O.M.L.A. juvenile "A" championship. Friday night Fred Flisnik and George McPhail scored goals late in the first period to wipe out a 2-0 St. Kitts lead. The locals then proceeded to outscore the visitors 5-1 in the second stanza and take a 7-3 lead. Fred Flisnik and Bob Turkoz scored twice each and Mike Marcoux once, while John Mouradian fired his third goal of

the game for St. Kitts. The athletics narrowed the count to 7-6 with three goals early in the third frame, before Mike Marcoux scored for Acton at 13:45. Tom Stockwell scored the visitors seventh goal, then Paul Kent tied the score on a shot that just dribbled past Acton goalie Gary Turkoz. Indusmins put the pressure on in the last five minutes and came up with three goals to wrap up the win. Mike Cooper scored the winner at 15:02 and Bob Turkoz added two insurance markers. Gary Turkoz stopped Athletic's two big guns John Mouradian and Larry Greenhalgh on breakaways in the final minutes. Acton served 16 penalties, while the visitors were handed 15. Paul Cooper and Art Young of St. Kitts tangled in the third period and both received fighting majors. Bob Turkoz scored four goals and Fred Flisnik three for Acton. Mike Marcoux scored two, and George McPhail and Mike Cooper added singles. John Mouradian fired a hat trick for St. Kitts, Larry Greenhalgh and Tom Stockwell each picked up a pair and Paul Kent scored one. Bob Turkoz contributed three assists and Craig Weldon one for the locals.

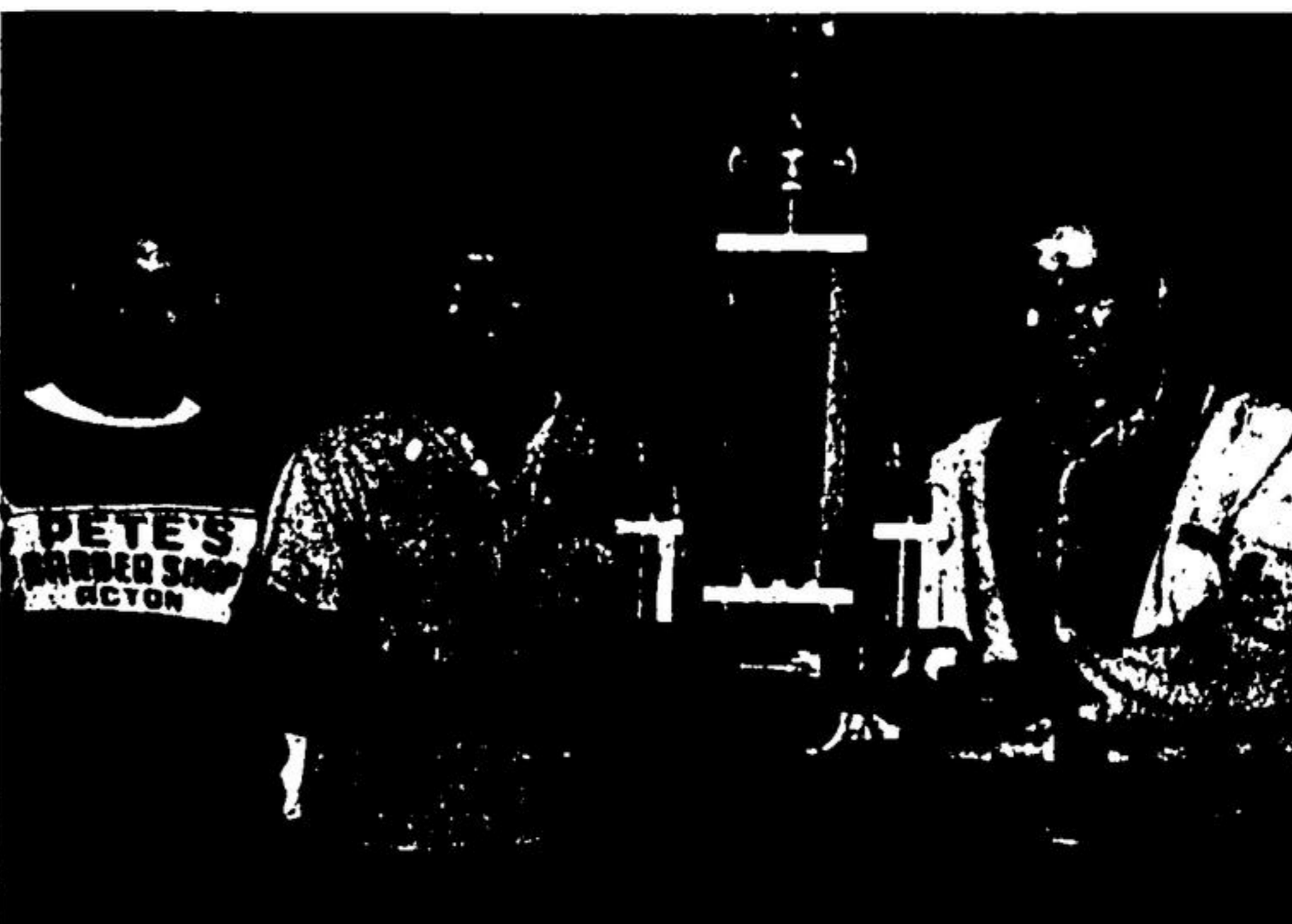
