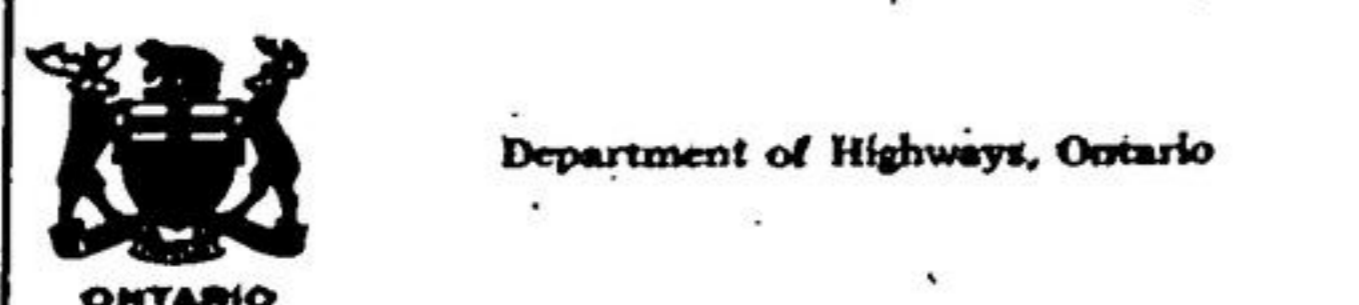

County engineer views road improvements

A total of \$1,416,764 was spent on construction and maintenance of Halton County roads, bridges and culverts during 1968, Halton's County Engineer D. J. Corbett notes in his annual report to Halton County Council this week.

Other miscellaneous expenses, new machinery, rebates to towns, overhead, stock, machine rentals, bank interest and charges brought the county's total expenditures to \$1,809,012.

In reporting on progress on roads during 1968 and the first eight months of 1969, Mr. Corbett lists the various projects completed or underway:

BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION
The Mountainview Road CNR grade separation, in Georgetown, was completed in the early Summer of 1968. Construction was carried out by the Town and the County's total share of the cost came to \$78,000.

Construction of the Upper Bridge in Glen Williams was finished during 1968 at a total cost of \$175,400. Because of grade and property restrictions our Consultant, V. R. Astrop, designed a unique structure — a post-tensioned prestressed rigid frame, in order to keep the height of the bridge and approaches down. I believe there are only two other similar type structures in the Province.

Replacement of the bridge on the Campbellville Sideroad in the westerly part of Concession 5, Nassagaweya, has been finished. Total cost, to date, of the new bridge and associated relocation of a small private dam and pond, is \$45,000. A small amount of work remains to be done on the approaches.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION
The 7th Line of Esquema and the diversion east of Hornby, from the No. 5 Sideroad to the Upper Base Line was finished in November of 1968. The total cost of this 2.25 mile project was \$464,000. Two concrete culverts were included in this project.

The Campbellville Sideroad through Concession 6 of Nassagaweya, which was started in 1968, was completed in July of this year at a total cost of \$95,000.

The Trafalgar Road through Concession 2 S.D.S., Oakville, from the Upper Middle Road to the O.E.W. started in September of 1968 and is now complete except for the installation of overhead illumination at Iroquois Shore Road. Total cost of this 1.1 mile four lane project is now estimated at \$635,000.

The Waterdown Road in Burlington, from Highway 403 for 1.25 miles north, was completed in June of 1968. Grading, base, gutter, storm sewer and paving work on the remaining 0.50 mile section of this road, south of Waterdown, was finished in July of this year. Many problems were encountered on this section, associated with utilities and delays due to inclement weather late in 1968.

Total cost to date for the entire 1.75 miles, is \$418,000. Nassagaweya Township's share of this cost is \$3,200.

BRIDGE AND CULVERT MAINTENANCE
Minimal maintenance work was done in 1968 and increased expenditures will be required in the future if we are to keep our bridges and culverts in an adequate state of repair.

This year we have tried a new type of protection for steel handrails — zinc powder metallizing which, while expensive, should give satisfactory protection for up to 10 years as opposed to the usual 3 to 4 years for paint.

ROAD MAINTENANCE
The Spring break-up this year was light, compared to 1968, and as a result expenditures for gravel patching and pavement repair are running approximately 30 per cent lower than 1968. To offset this, however, dry weather

this summer has resulted in dusting expenditures which will be some 40 per cent higher than 1968.

Winter control costs in 1968 were \$93,500, and it is estimated that the 1969 cost will be \$88,000.

Surface treatment, consisting of asphalt and stone chip, was applied on 25 miles of paved road in 1968 and 28 miles in 1969.

Other routine maintenance work has been carried out as required.

In the future, I would like to see a higher level of service provided for dust control on our gravel roads, because of increasing traffic. More asphalt dust layer should be used to affect better dust control and surface gravel retention.
