Converted farm buildings house animated film studios

By Brian Ward A small industry is flourishing in northern Nassagaweya township under the guidance of two township councillor Allan Ackman, who is well known as

one of Canada's best animators. Mr. Ackman started his career before the Second World War by taking a commercial art course in Toronto. At the start of the war he joined the R.C.A.F. and

service with him. Right after V.E. Day, day, he joined the National Film Board animation department and soon came to know and became a protege of Norman McLaren who was one of the first men to experiment with pop art and new techniques in films. Mr. Ackman worked on animated maps and technical diagrams for the NFB's many educational films and gradually built up enough knowledge about the business to enable him to go out on his own.

He married in 1949 and he and his wife moved from NFB's headquarters in Ottawa to Toronto where he went to work for an advertising agency, Rapid Grip and Batten. Mr. Ackman commercials although this changed as early television productions demanded animated commercials.

Mr. Ackman operated his own studio in Toronto in 1954, doing

Five years ago, he moved out to northern Nassagaweya to re-establish himself once moré. but this time it was to be away from the pressures of city life and highly competitive organized the animation advertising. He and his wife have converted a farm and outbuildings into studios and offices for their staff and Mr. Ackman transformed what was

once swamp land around his farm to usable recreation land. complete with a well-stocked

What was the bam has been transformed into a three-level studio which is the main work ares for Mr. Ackman and his staff. The basement is used for storage and there is also a large camera which is used to photograph, frame by frame, the hand-drawn animated pictures. The first floor is used as a reception area while the second floor, which is a converted hay toft, is used as a studio for both staff and free-lance artists who do the individual drawings which, when combined, make up an animated film. Film editing, sound editing and film previewing is also done on the second floor.

Mr. Ackman is still very involved in the animation field which he says "is a lifetime of study." He explained this study involved watching the movements of animate objects and finding out how they moved in order to reproduce them on paper and then on film.

He said the future of animation is in education but criticized some of the methods used in schools today. explained schools have lots of equipment to train the students but they need more experience in the field to learn what it's really like to get out in the real work world.

Presently Mr. Ackman is doing some educating on his own. He is trying to teach smaller businesses that it is not too expensive to advertise on television and to prove his point, he and his company, Animation Productions Ltd. have produced "Instant Commercials".

There are 30-second "spot" commercials which have already been made and just require a dealer's name to be put on them. Mr. Ackman says he is running into some opposition from television stations which already have their own slides which they believe are adequate for smaller advertisers.
