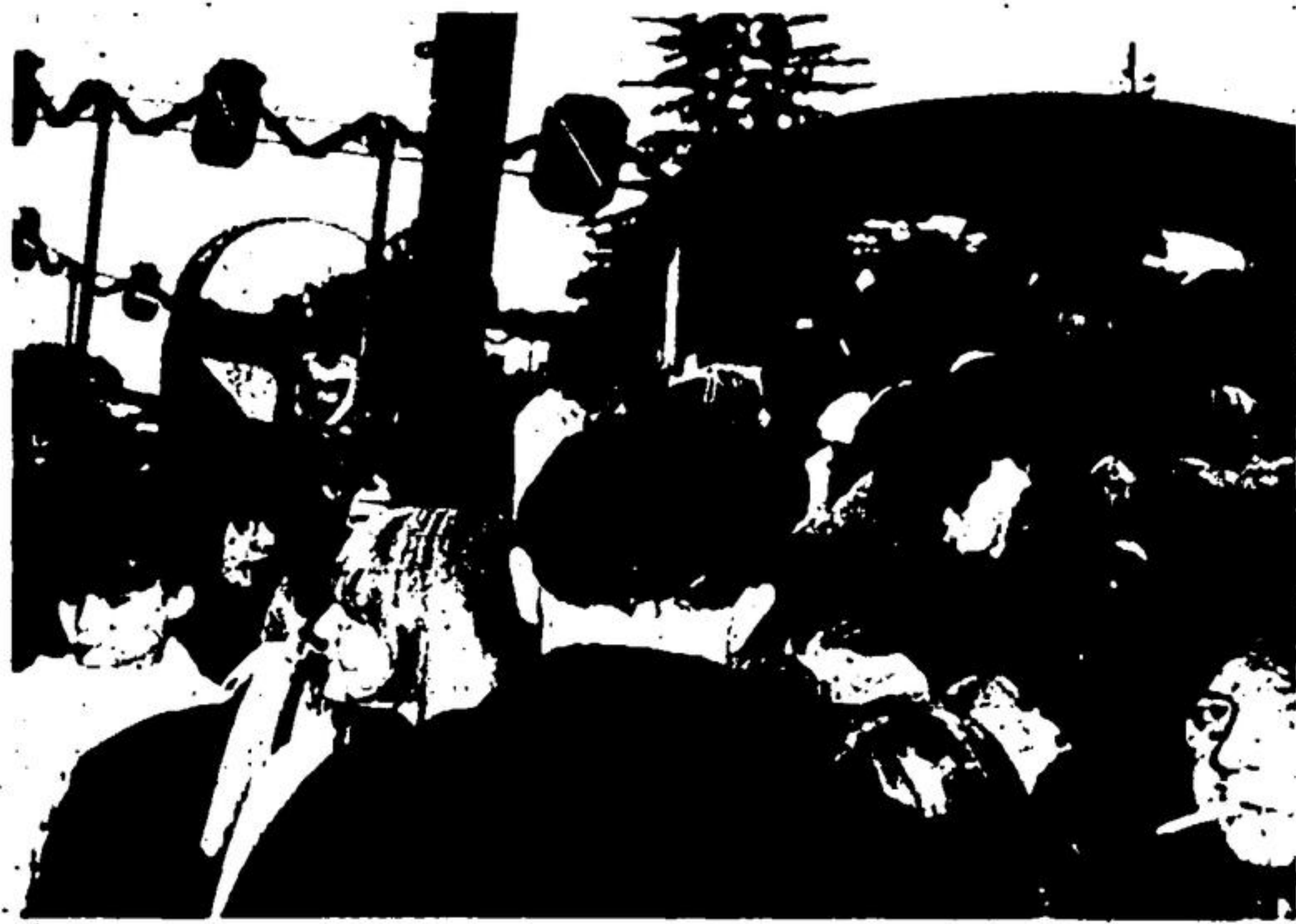


BRASS BAND of the Lorne Scots paraded and then played an hour-long concert during the first part of the afternoon program at the fair.—(Staff Photo)



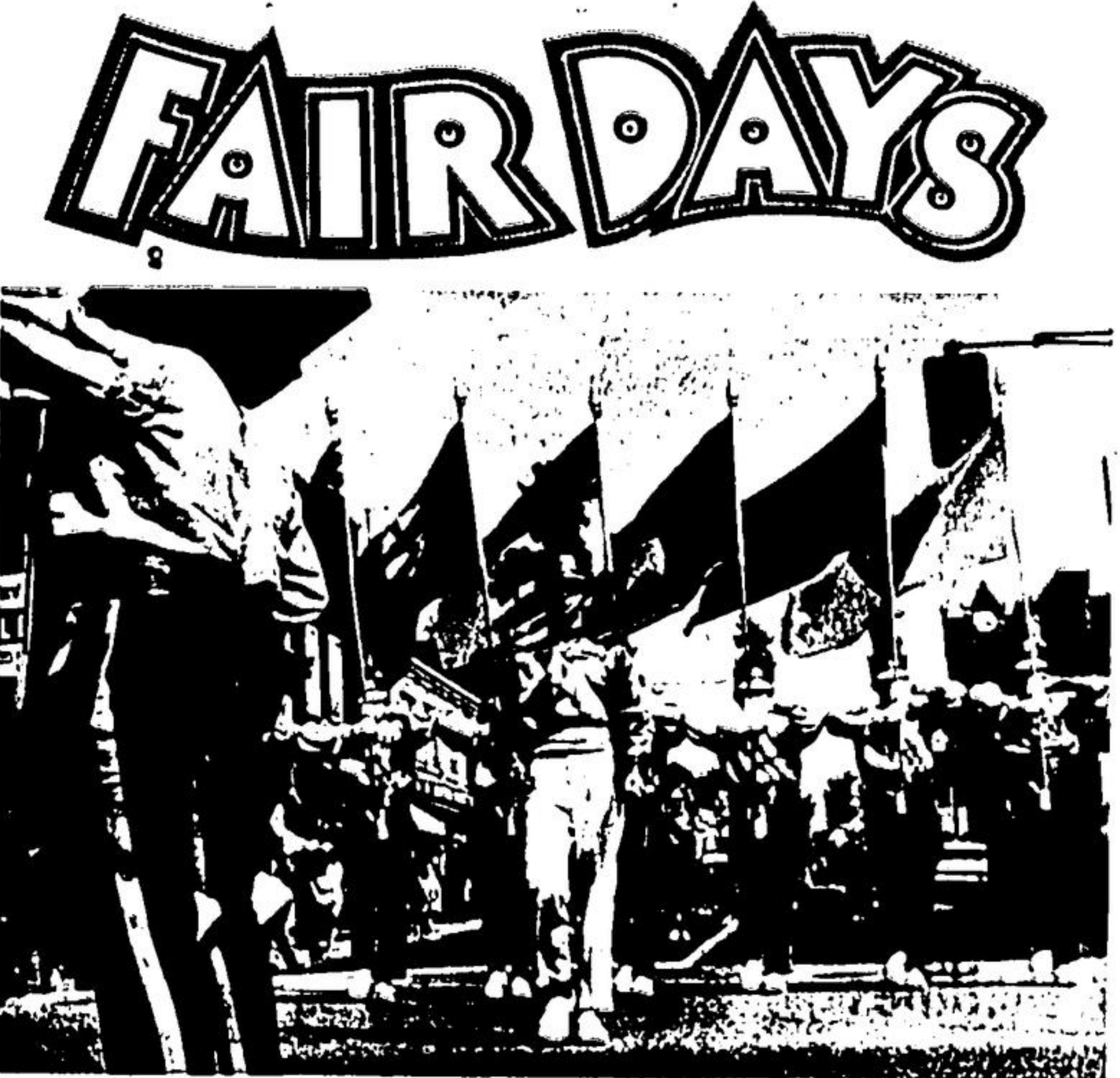
MIDWAY RIDES at the Fall Fair were well patronized and huge lineups formed in front of each ride, as patrons waited their turn.—(Staff Photo)

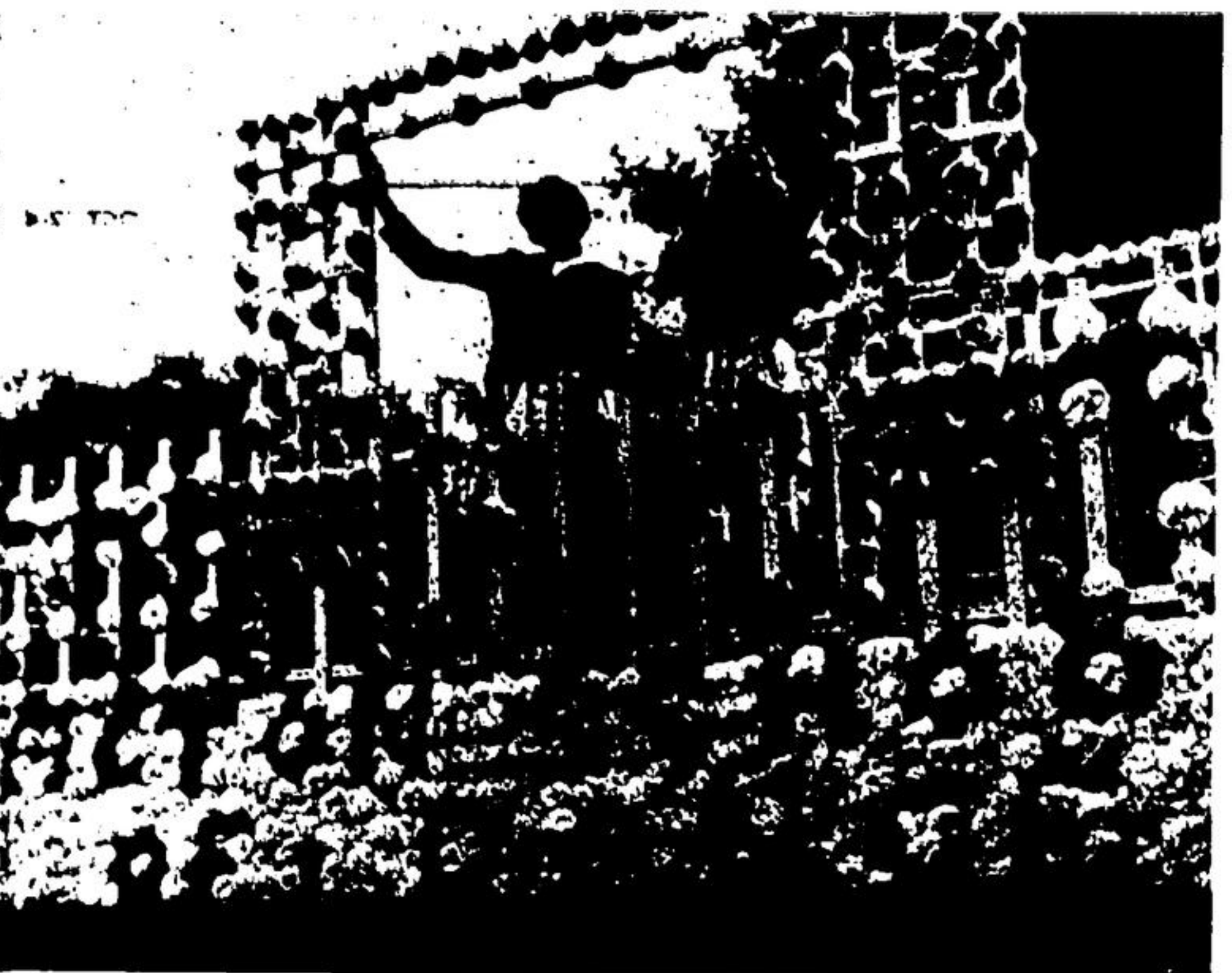
