

## Acton-flavored CMC'S face UofG Gryphons here Nov. 3

Four Acton Minor Hockey Association graduates, Paul Cooper, Pete Marzocco, Brent Marshall and Jim Barden will be wearing the colors of the Guelph CMC's, when the Central Ontario Junior "B" squad, face the University of Guelph Gryphons in an exhibition game in the Community Centre, Monday November 3.

The two teams will meet in what is bound to be an exciting opener to the hockey season in Acton.

Paul Cooper, who played his minor hockey in Acton played goal for CMC's last year and was named to the second all-star team in the league. Pete Marzocco and Brent Marshall both played with Acton's O.M.H.A. Juvenile "B" quarter-finalists last year and are in their first season of Junior "B" play. Jim Barden, a native of Eden Mills, played his minor hockey here before moving on to Markham Junior "B" and Guelph Imperials of the Western Ontario Junior League last year.

CMC's under new coach Billy Taylor lost their league opener to Owen Sound, but bounced back to knock off Collingwood 5-3 in Guelph Sunday night.

The Gryphons, who have

several former Junior players in their lineup, will be guided this year by Dewey Chambers former star defenseman with the powerful St. Michael's Majors of the O.H.A. Junior "A" league and later with Canada's National Team.

Acton fans will be able to watch a fast exciting hockey game and contribute to the support of minor hockey in Acton at the same time since the two teams have generously agreed to donate all proceeds of the game to the Acton Tri-county Minor Hockey Association.

# O.M.H.A. cracks down on rough players

"The O.M.H.A. Executive has instructed their referees to be very firm with all offenders," president Gordon Hawes of Whitley told delegates at the Association's annual meeting in Toronto Saturday. "Two infractions which were much too prevalent last season are high sticking and profane language," Mr. Hawes went on.

Later on in the meeting delegates from all parts of the province supported their president's feelings by passing three important executive amendments to the constitution. Effective January 1, 1970, there must be at least one carded official in every O.M.H.A. game and effective January 1, 1971 both officials in O.M.H.A. midget and juvenile games must be carded.

Any player assessed a game misconduct penalty in the last ten minutes of any group or playoff game shall be automatically suspended from the next game his team playing in the same series or succeeding O.M.H.A. series. The responsible officer of the team shall see that this rule is enforced without further notice.

In all group play, except group play-offs, any five minute penalty for fighting that is assessed after the start of the third period will incur a suspension for the remainder of the game.

Other amendments passed included one which will prevent any teams involved in O.M.H.A. semi-finals or finals from competing in tournaments until such time as they are eliminated from playdowns and another which will make it mandatory for goalkeepers in all age groups to wear both a helmet and face mask. An amendment proposed by the Bancroft Minor Hockey Association recommending that the O.M.H.A. conduct a provincial championship series at the Novice level was soundly defeated.

Barry Inscow, one of five Acton delegates spoke against the proposed amendment and received enthusiastic applause for his comments. Mr. Inscow explained that he felt novices, at nine and ten years of age were a little too young to be travelling long

distances to play hockey, especially around playoff time which coincides with school exam time. He added that the present system of declaring zone champions should be maintained.

Other Acton delegates included Ron McKnight, Harold Townsley, John Weldon and Jim

James. Denis Gibbons also attended as a visitor.

Tri-county group convener Jim Kinley of Etobicoke was returned as third vice-president of the O.M.H.A.

Most delegates took in the Leaf-Chicago game at Maple Leaf Gardens following the meeting.
