Township refuses request for land separation

Monday right, Esquesing council passed a resolution that separation of land to F. David Thompson from R. Bruce Frame, where there is not 125 feet frontage on an established food, be refused.

Mr. Thompson had previously presented his request for a land eparation to committee of adjustment, who referred the matter to council. At their October 6 meeting, council postponed a decision on the request until they had a chance to seek the advice of their solicitor and until a full council was present

The township solicitor's read Monday night, sumested points that should be included in any agreement Mr. Thompson and Mr. Frame would draw up between themselves, so that the township would not be responsible at any time in the future for maintaining the right of way:


