Minister replies to letter

The Editor, Acton Free Press.

Dear Sir:

A few weeks ago you were good enough to publish a letter of mine dealing with the air pollution and odour problem in Acton. As a result of that letter, a number of people phoned me expressing their approval and assuring me of their help in any action I might decide to take. This was followed by a gathering of these people at my house where we discussed ways and means.

It was decided at the meeting that a token petition be circulated covering certain parts of the town. This was done and nearly 150 signatures were collected by a number of people genuinely interested in doing something about the pollution and odour problem.

Almost 100% of the people visited were only too anxious to sign the petition and had we the time and the volunteers to cover the whole town I feel we would have had the same excellent response.

Copies of the signatures received together with a letter of explanation were sent to the Hon. G. A. Kerr O. C., Minister of Energy and Resources. Enclosed is a copy of the Minister's reply. Would you be good enough to publish it in your paper so that both the canvassers and the petitioners are kept informed of the result of their efforts.

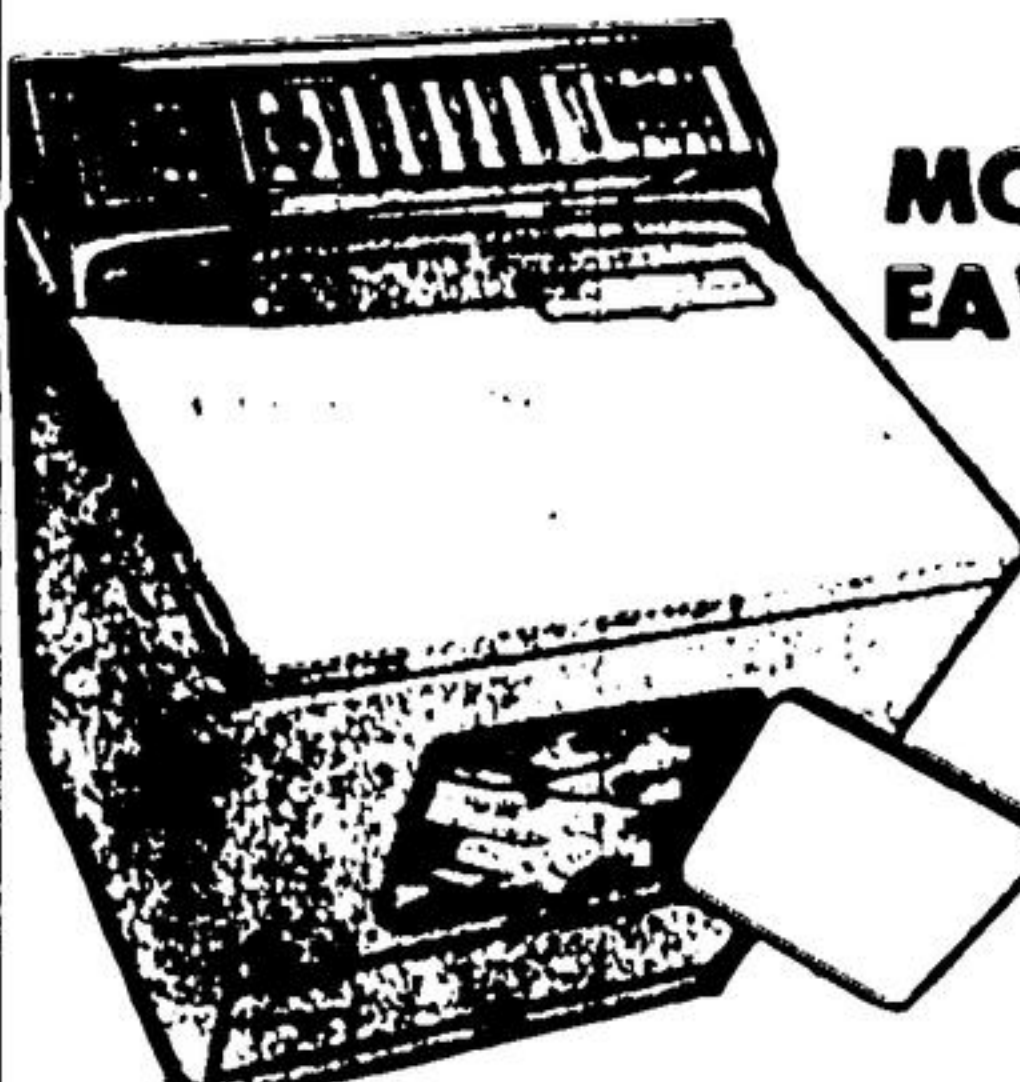

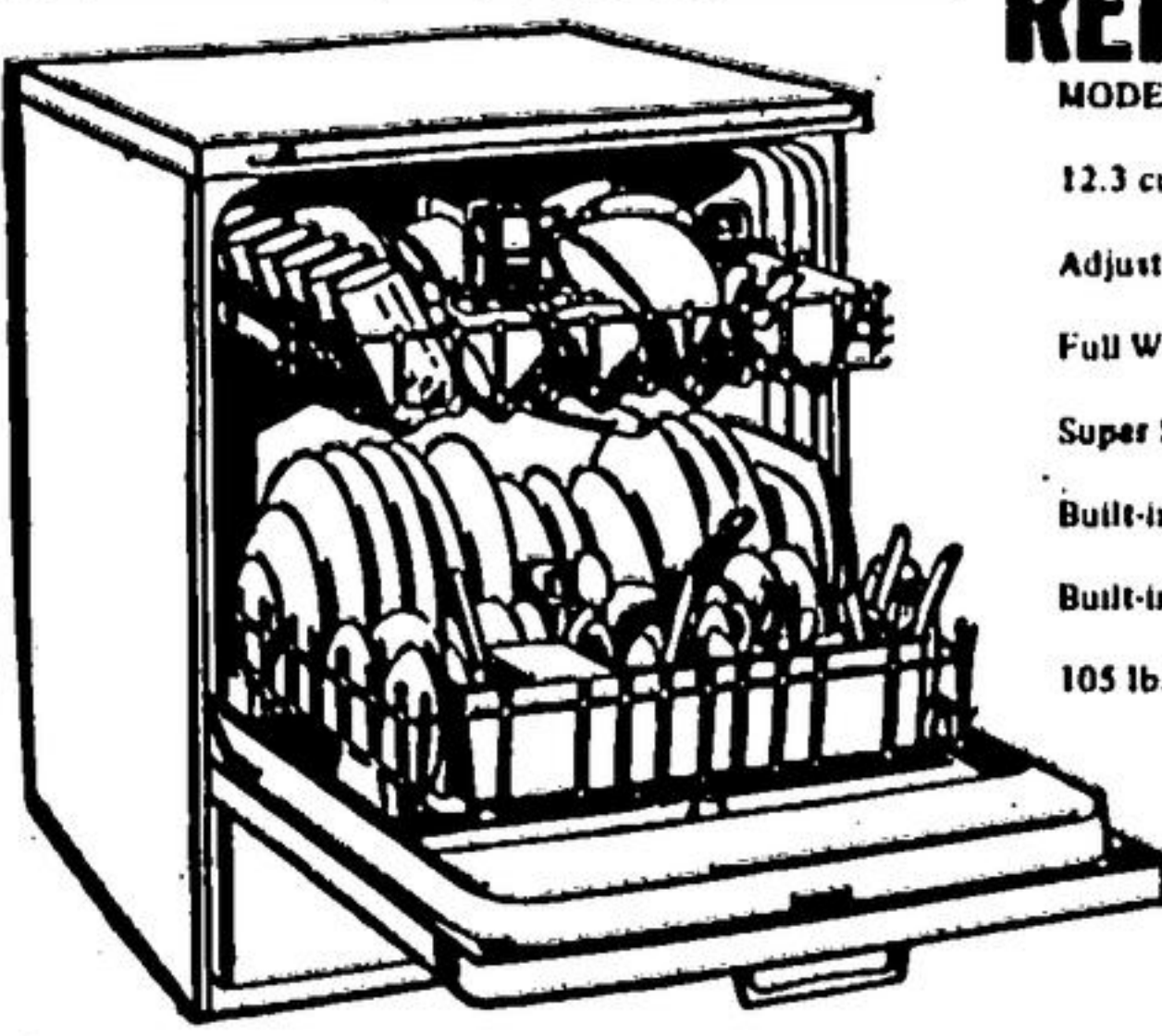
