Besides Kalapaca's hat trick, Dew Lyons, Don Arch and Larry Kack also scored for the winners.

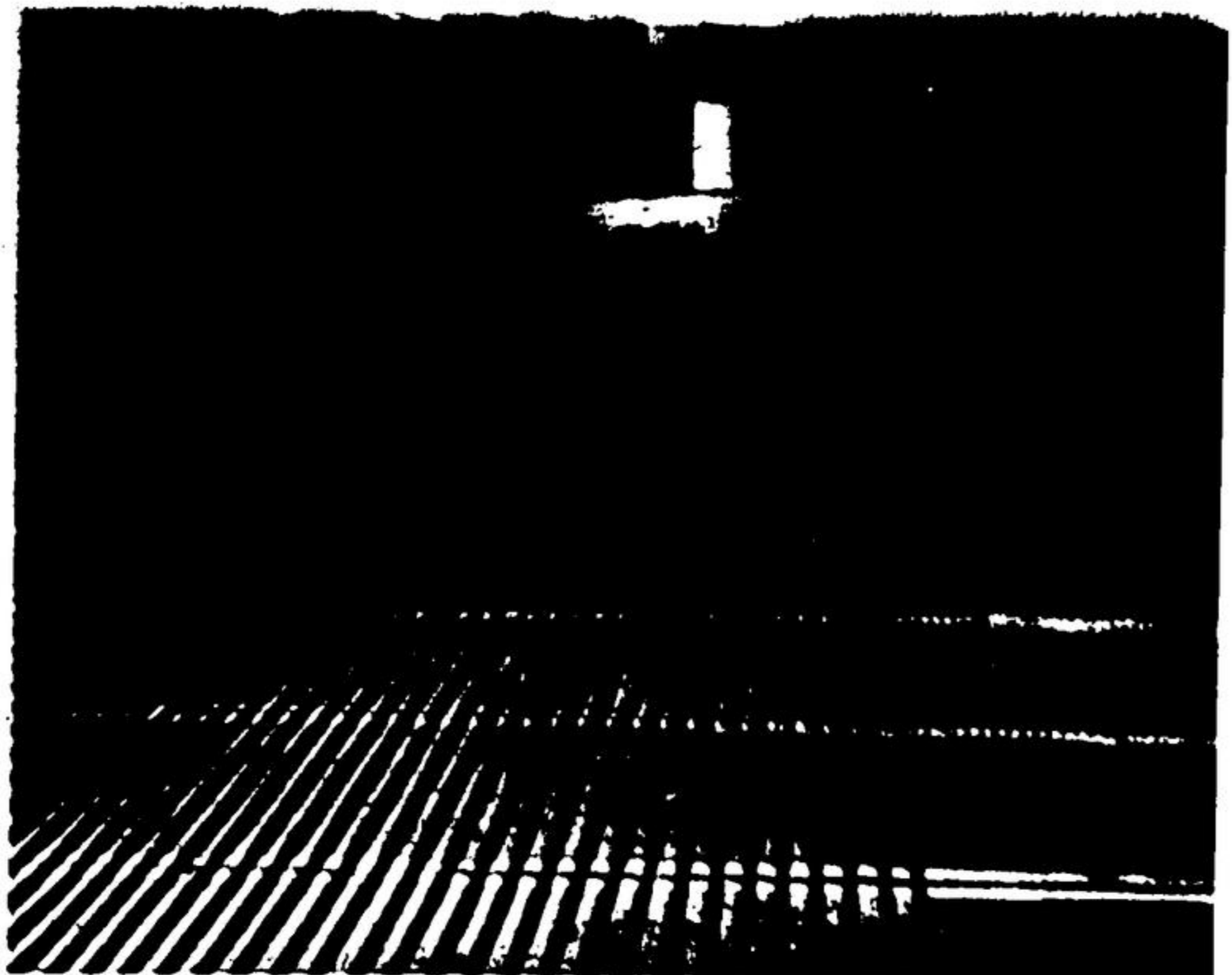
Referees Barry Incoe and Gary Masales handed out six penalties to Acton and three to Streetsville.

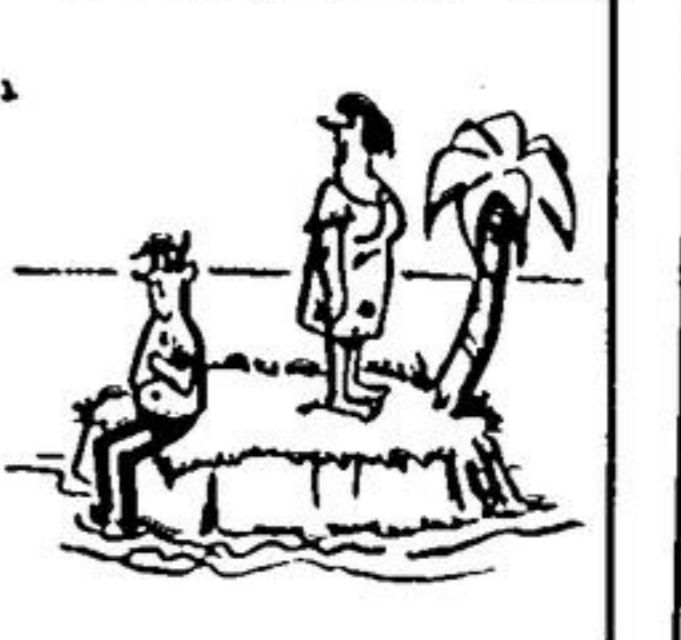
