



Team effort pays off

Tanners win!

Perseverance finally paid off for Acton Tanners last night. After losing 23 out of 24 league games last year and their first four this year, Tanners turned in a tremendous team effort to upset Cheltenham Harvesters 7-5.

Tanners trailed 3-1 at the end of the first period, but fought back to tie the score with two unanswered second period markers and wrapped up the win with four goals in the final stanza. Kevin Hall scored the seventh goal into an empty net at 19:47 as Harvesters pulled their goalie in favor of an extra forward.

Harry "Red" Phillips scored Acton's first goal at 17:30 of the opening period on a pass from Harold Townsley. The McDuffe brothers, Bruce and Brian assisted on Steve Townsley's goal at 2:43 of the second period, before Kevin Hall tied the game up on a breakaway at 16:08.

John Mason scored his third goal of the season on a pass from Brian McDuffe to give Tanners a 4-3 lead only to have Cheltenham bounce back to tie the score at 5:17.

The McDuffe brothers then scored back to back goals to put Acton in front 6-4. Bruce scored unassisted at 12:04 and Brian tallied what proved to be the winner at 17:07, with Harold Townsley assisting.

Harvesters got one goal back at 18:25, and applied the pressure for the final two minutes, but Tanners held the fort and Hall's goal into the empty net wrapped up the win.

Bruce Thomason played his usual strong game in goal for Acton and Jack Poot was very effective killing off penalties.

Tanners served 11 of the 16 minor penalties in the game. Stu McDonald suffered a minor cut that required two stitches to close.

It was a well-earned win for Tanners and sets the stage for what should be an interesting home and home series with Georgetown Raiders this weekend. The two teams play here Friday night at 8:30, then tangle in Georgetown Sunday afternoon at 2:30.

Raiders apparently have added several new players to their roster and recently upset first place Lucan Jets 7-4. Jets had shellacked Raiders 2-1 in Lucan earlier this year.
