Acton went down to defeat 10-2 at the hands of a powerful Brampton team.

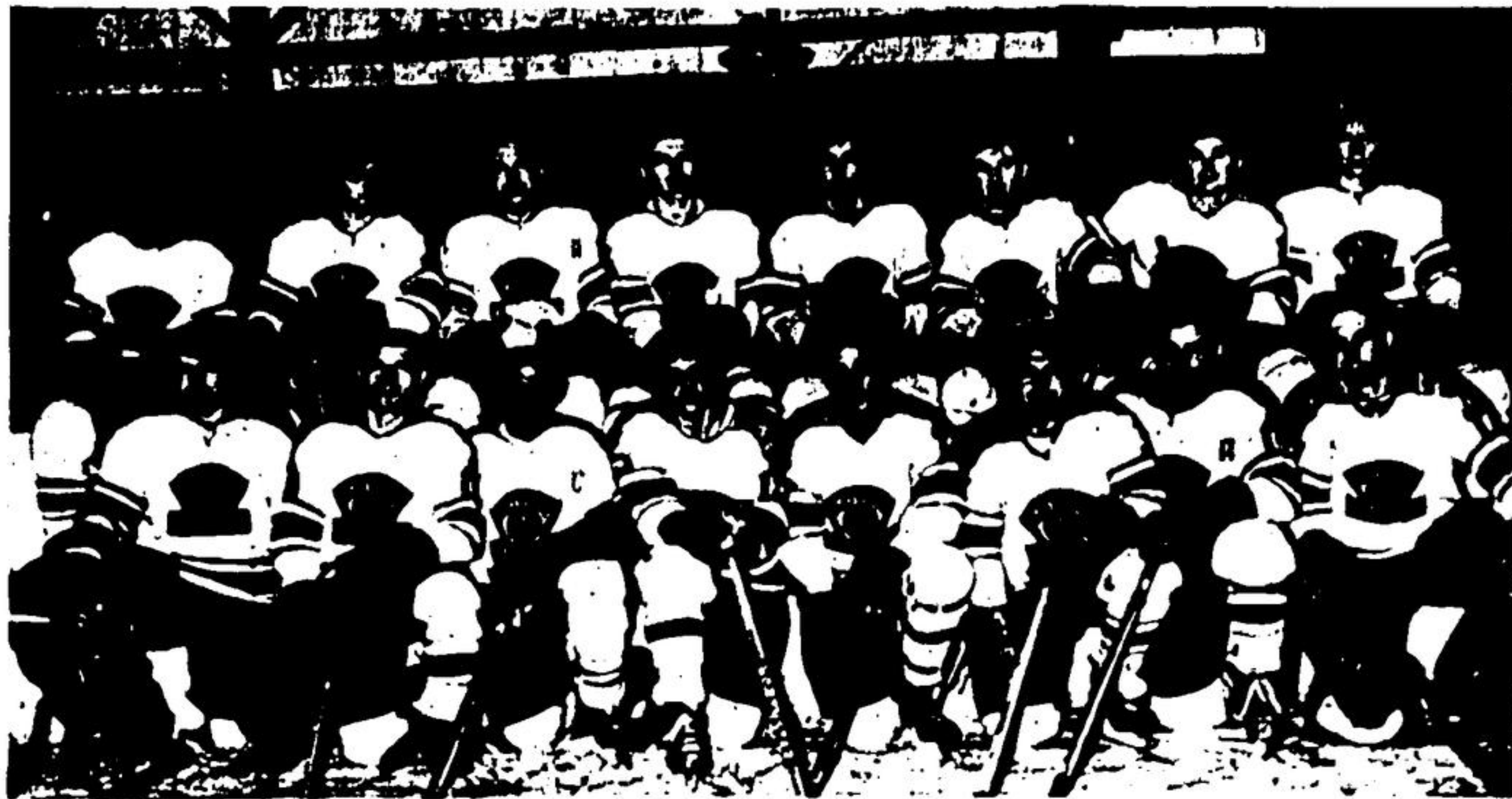
Pete Morrison and Gary Turkosz scored for Acton Sunday. Morrison scored the only Acton goal in last night's encounter.

Ever since the final gun sounded at the Montreal Autostade Sunday, there's been considerable discussion among sports fans about two questions: (a) Would Saskatchewan have won under better field conditions? and (b) Did Russ Jackson really deserve the game's MVP award or were the ballots actually cast the night before?

I don't think there's any doubt that Saskatchewan's main offensive weapon, bruising fullback George Reed was minimized by the sloppy condition of the field. Big George was held to just 28 yards rushing in 11 carries. However, both teams had to put up with the field and on this particular Sunday, Frank Clair's Ottawa crew adjusted more readily and made the most of a bad situation.

Unlike hockey or baseball playoff series where losing teams get a second chance, football championships are decided in one game and it's the team that's "up" for that particular game, that brings home the bacon.

The Baltimore Colts found that out in Miami last January. After that game many people still said the Colts could take the Jets four out of five. Unfortunately for the Colts they played the fifth game first!

The second question can probably be debated for the rest of time. Ron Stewart and Jim Mankins both had outstanding games and Jerry Campbell and Don Sutherin turned in superb defensive efforts.

Offensive guards Tom Schuette and Dave Braggins executed blocking assignments perfectly, especially on the 80 yard screen pass play to Stewart.

But it's the rudder that steers the ship and in the game of football the rudder is the quarterback. Russ Jackson steered Ottawa's ship to victory Sunday with superb play - calling, pin-point passing and the poise of a real pro.
