hibition resolution. Sir Wilfrid Laurier
said he would do so after the redistribution
bill was disposed of. And the mem-
bers laughed.

The standing taken by the 20th Battalion at the Niagara Camp, should lead

men who brought the county so prominently
before the country. The 20th
took a decided step in advance of the ar-
