Georgetown recently issued by the British Govt. Registration indicates that the death rate throughout the United Kingdom is extremely low. Indeed, the figures for the present year show the number of deaths as 11,707, which is a rate of 12.8 per 1000 population per annum. In the City of London, the death rate, 11, is lower than that of any capital of Europe. The death rate in England and Wales, 21,424 were of children under one year of age, infantile mortality being 1 per 1000, or 19 below the average, and the lowest recorded in any quarter since civil registration was established.

Two members of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association are making a tour of the Northwest, and are being furnished with some interesting truths by the people of the western cities. One fact which is being presented for their consideration is that eastern manufacturers do not show sufficient enterprise in producing goods to compete with American firms. There is reason to believe that there is a great deal of truth in this, and it is up to the manufacturers' association to see that more enterprises are displayed by its members. The same complaint had been made by trade associations in Australia, New Zealand and other places. If the Canadian manufacturers expect to retain their markets it is up to them to exert themselves in supplying customers, so that there will not be so much complaint in regard to their unenterprising methods of doing business.
