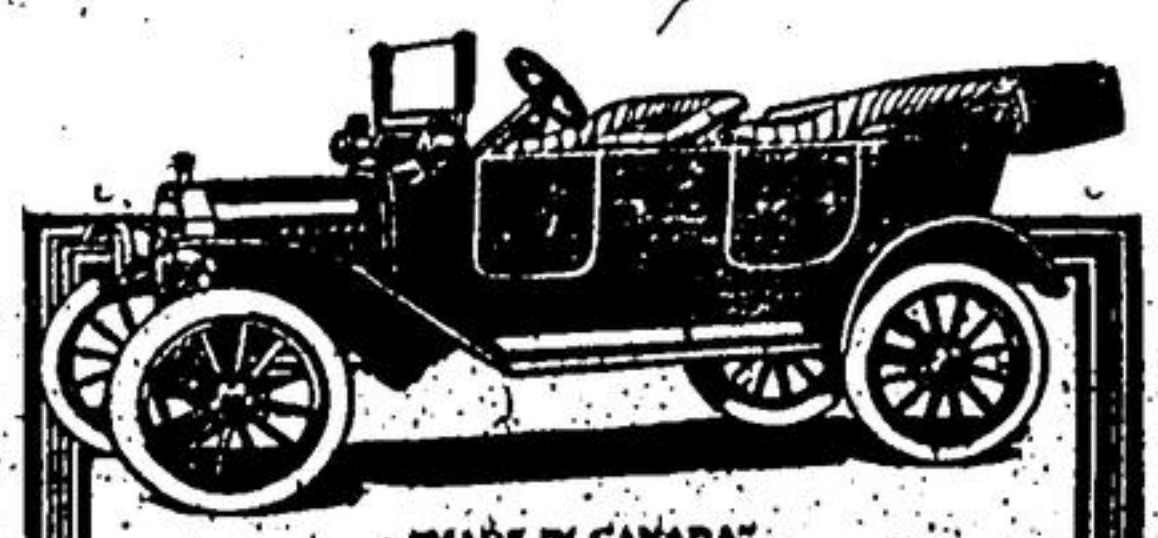
Looking for England.

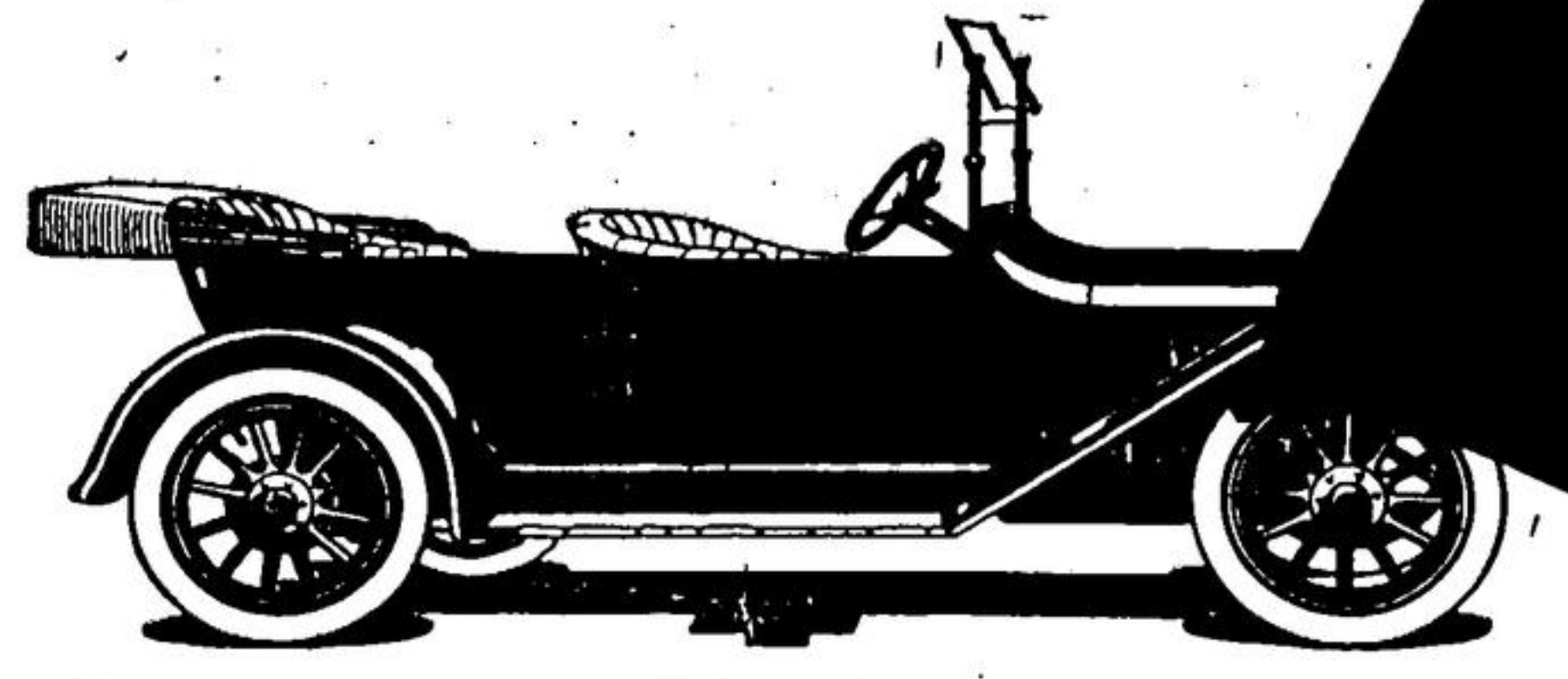
