TO ANYONE WHO WANTS THE FULL OFFICIAL LIST OF CANADA'S NEW GOVERNOR-GENERAL, here it is, according to the Canadian Gazette:

His Excellency the Right Honorable Victor Christian William, Duke of Devonshire, Marquess of Hartington, Earl of Devonshire, Earl of Burlington, Baron Cavendish of Keighley; Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Garter; Order of His Majesty's Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order; Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor-General, and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominions of Canada.

To meet the growing demands of the Hydro-Electric Power System, the Ontario Government has acquired certain rights to the use of water power available at Niagara Falls and has enacted legislation to proceed with the greatest power development in the world.

Believing it advisable to have this great development under the control of the municipalities, the Ontario Municipal Electric Association, which represents the municipalities with regard to the Hydro Power Movement, has passed a resolution requesting that the question be submitted to the Niagara Municipalities as to whether one complete power development and distribution system controlled and operated by the municipalities. The advantages of each municipality becoming a part owner in this great project and in the hands of the municipalities is quite obvious and our council has therefore presented a by-law to the people

In voting on this by-law you will be expressing your wishes as to whether you want the Ontario Government to retain the control of the hydroelectric power and allow the municipalities to develop and own this great project themselves.
