Notice

In accordance with the Revised Statutes of Ontario, the dog by-law of the Corporation of Georgetown has been amended and the following provisions are hereby made:

Sections 11 and 14 have been amended to read:

That there shall be levied and collected annually upon the owner of every male dog a sum of \$1, if only one, and \$2 for each additional male dog, and \$5 for every female, if only one and \$5 for each additional female.

That the owner or harbinger of any such dog male or female shall pay in the hands of the owner of the same immediately at the time of making the annual payment, the amount of the tax imposed by this section, and the amount shall be registered in a book to be returned to the clerk with the assessment roll.

Every male or female dog shall wear a tag and any dog wearing them are liable to be shot.

The penalties of Georgetown having done are notified to this effect.
