### TO DAY'S STORY.

#### AN OLD TIME FARM

And the Methods That Were in Use in the Year 1840.

#### DAYS OF THE SIMPLE LIFE.

When All Kinds of Clothing Were Made at Home, When Eggs Sold For a Shilling a Dozen and the High Cost of Living Was Not a Big Problem.

In view of the modern day high cost of living and of the many wonderful advances made in the last century—the automobile, the ocean cable, the telephone, the electric light, the typewriter and the amazing changes these inventions have necessarily wrought in all directions in almost every walk of life—it may be of interest to recall the conditions on a farm in the year 1840.

The farm I have in mind consisted of 200 acres. The stock was fifteen cows, a yoke of oxen, a horse, an old white horse, a dozen pigs, fifty hens, a few ducks and a stock of sheep.

The farm was worked at "spring" and made into rolls for spinning. At home it was spun into yarn and woven on a hand loom. For beds the covers were made of flannel and black wool were used to produce a gray like the Confederate uniform.

There was no iron underwear. Stockings were knitted from wool as well as made of flannel. Caps with ear flaps were of rabbit skin. There was no shoes. In the winter boots came up to the knee.

Several cows were killed each year. There was a larder near by, where the meat was stored. A shambles was made and gave much trouble and pain.

The fat, cut and laid down until the fiber loosened from the woody part. It was put through a mangle and then into a tub. The wool was then washed and then spun into yarn. The wool was then woven into cloth. The cloth was then made into garments.

For food we had everything needed—milk, butter, cheese, cabbage, pumpkins, peaches, apples, which lasted from fall to spring, cider, which gave vinegar or produced a few clippings.

Half a dozen pigs killed in the fall gave plenty of ham and bacon. The ham and bacon were hung up in the smokehouse. A small building with no opening except the door, and the fire produced more smoke than heat, but gave the ham and bacon a very delicious flavor.

From the cow's milk we made both butter and cheese. What butter and cheese the family used was made in a nearby village. Butter usually brought 12 1/2 cents a pound. Cheese was sold at 5 to 6 cents a pound. All eggs not used went to the village store and brought 10 cents to 12 cents a dozen.

Every farmer made his own soap. It was made of soap. It was soft, but very strong, and took the dirt off your hands and face very thoroughly and some skin also unless you were careful in your selection.

Little was heard of the world at large. Twenty miles from the railroad the great four horse stagecoaches came every day, bringing the mail. There were few newspapers or magazines. The telegraph was unknown. The Atlantic cable did not succeed until 1866. There were only twenty-three miles of railroad in the world.

The wonderful agencies which have added to the power of man in the last century will not be lost, but will be added to constantly. The many problems of the modern day high cost of living can only be solved by time and the efforts of our great grandfathers.

How Indigo is Produced. A primitive but effective method of obtaining indigo in southern India is practiced by the natives. The plant is cut in the day it is cut in a large vat, into which water is run. The boards are then placed over the vat and the vat is covered with a top and for ten or twelve hours, during which time a heavy fermentation takes place. The liquid is then drained off into another vat, after which cooling

## ALASKA'S LONG SPUN

The Aleutian Islands Chain Over a Thousand Miles in Length.

Few persons are aware that the longest rope from San Francisco by Japan is by way of Alaska. Nearly a thousand miles are saved to vessels sailing west by coasting along the Aleutian Islands rather than following the Hawaiian route.

The Aleutian Islands, which extend in a chain from the Gulf of Alaska to the Bering Sea, are inhabited by the remnants of the great race of the revolution closed just as the American Revolutionary war began. No people were left in the islands until they succumbed to the Russians only after a contest of nearly fifty years, and then simply because the race was almost exterminated in the struggle.

While the Aleutian Islands must eventually form an important link in the commerce between the United States and the Orient, other islands look toward Alaska, the United States to the north. In the narrow Bering Strait lie two little islands, one occupied by the Eskimos, the other by the natives, so that citizens of the two great nations live on respective islands within a few miles of each other.

Evening Schools. Evening schools were their education to the Aleutian Islands, who about 1811 set up one at Iliamna, which proved to be quite successful. In 1830 or 1840 the English Bishop Hinde strongly recommended such schools for the poor adults, who, on account of enforced labor, had no chance to secure an education. The idea was taken in hand by the British privy council in 1851, and from that date evening schools began to be considered seriously. At the present time they are numerous throughout Great Britain, America and many other leading nations.
