FOR THE FIRST week of Toronto Fair, not a case of diphtheria was reported. Presumably that is the result of the fact that we now have "dry" Ontario or nearly so.

No delay shall be permitted in dealing with seditions utterances in Montreal or anywhere else. Indifference in Ireland allowed the Sinn Feiners there to spread their rebellious teachings. We want none of it in Canada.

Australasia's surplus of butter in the new season will reach an estimated value of more than \$2,000,000, consequently the possibility of selling 10,000 tons to Canada and the U.S. is welcomed in the industry. The Prime Minister has been in negotiation with the United States.

It would be unfortunate if the grants from the patriotic fund to the wives of soldiers overseas had to be curtailed, and it is well that the matter has been brought to the attention of the County Council. There are many and worthy demands in this dual-born patriotic cause mentioned. But it is a rule that no one should have too many lemons of grants to families whose men are representing us at the front.

We do not deny that a tax rate of 40 mills may be a necessity at the present time. We believe that it is necessary to have a tax to provide for the war effort. But it is a rule that a good advancement for our town should be made to hope that its necessity is only a temporary matter. We believe that as long as it will be found advisable to study the situation with a view to discovering a way by which the reasonable needs of the Municipality can be met, without at the same time placing upon the people too heavy a burden of taxation.

OWING to changes in the Federal franchise, provincial lists cannot be used at the coming election, and new lists must be compiled. For this purpose it is probable the enumerator system, now in use in Alberta and Saskatchewan, will be adopted. By this system an elector in each polling subdivision will be designated as the head of a household, and he will be named on such list, but not on the final qualification. An elector whose name is omitted may "wear" his vote, but this will not be counted until passed upon by a competent court after the election.

NOW THAT conscription has passed and is in effect, it is the patriotic duty of all to do their best to assist the front. The selection of districts to go to the front. A good deal has been said about the exemption clauses and the fact that agriculturists and munition workers will not fear its effects. Neither of these classes will escape as a class. The young farmer and the young munition worker has as much right to endure the share of danger as the man in the city.
