DRIVERS' REGULATIONS in regard to fuel are summarized in an order-in-council just issued in Ottawa.

All importers and dealers in coal must be licensed. Heavy penalties are provided for persons doing business without this permit. It is required that brokers not get more than \$60 per ton for their services, wholesalers no more than 25 cents and retailers not more than 50 cents. Regarding delivery of coal, it is provided that except between the months of April & September, importers and consumers shall obtain quality coal at a price of 40 cents per ton for the winter with the minimum allowance of that town. The fuel controller will have full power to requisition any quantity of coal over-supplied from any consumer in case of emergency.

AS WE UNDERSTAND IT, the name of no male voter will be placed on the list of voters to be used at the coming election. As far as we understand, all names of likely voters were placed on the voter list in the regular way, they cannot vote. The enumeration will, however, place the names of certain women on the list of qualifications for such being defined as follows: "Every female person shall be capable of voting and qualified to vote at a Dominion election, who is a British subject and qualified as to age, race and residence, and the wife, widow, mother, sister or daughter of any person, male or female, living or dead, who is a member of the Canadian Forces, or in any of the military forces, or with or without any of the naval forces of Canada or Great Britain in the present war."
