To Save Creditors

Meatless Days Changed

Owing to the Roman Catholic Lenten restrictions the meatless days will be Wednesdays and Fridays throughout Canada. The change went into effect on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Hotels and restaurants must not be served at any time. Henceforth no proprietor of a public eating place can avoid serving corn bread, dat-cakes or similar substitutes for white bread under the conditions of the Meatless Days.

Similar work must not be served at more than one meal on any day and on Wednesdays and Fridays must not be served at any time. Henceforth no proprietor of a public eating place can avoid serving corn bread, dat-cakes or similar substitutes for white bread under the conditions of the Meatless Days.

To avoid this difficulty, the word potatoes has been definitely eliminated from the list of prohibited foods and in future some substitute or substitute must be served at every meal when white bread is served.
