BUMPER BEAN CROP ASSURED

Experts Agree That Final Figures May Show 25,000,000 Bushels, and Lower Prices Are in Sight.

There is cheering reassurance in the news that this year's crop of beans will be much more than double the average yield, says the Indianapolis News. As a rule the country produces 10,000,000 bushels a year. In 1916, however, when the demand was greater than ever before, the crop was only 9.000,000 bushels. The shortage was immediately reflected in the soaring prices, and the lowly bean, as a consequence, came in a new prominence. Scarcity served as nothing else to bring about a realization of its value

and an appreciation of the place it occupies on the American month, ... This year, experts agree, the final figures may show a crop of \$5,000,000 bushels. The consumer this winter should find beans restored to their normal prices. "Navy" beans they are called by some, by others they are known as

"army" beant. The New Englander calls them merely beans. The reference to them; however, at "navy" or "army" benes is note without sight Boance.
