**NO DUTY ON MAPLE SUGAR**  
Maple sugar makers never had such a demand to fill as this year. The shortage of maple and best sugar makes it difficult to get a good supply of maple sugar. Every sugar maple tree available should be tapped this spring.

**YOUR UNTAPPED TREES**  
"If you had fifty cows and they all gave good marketable, money-saving milk," said H. J. Grimm, addressing the Pure Maple Sugar Association, "you surely would not be content to milk only twenty-five of them and let the others go to waste, would you? And yet your untapped sugar maple trees are just like those imaginary un-milked cows. There is money in them only waiting to be brought out and put in your bank. Maple sugar is the quickest money making harvest in all your business of farming. It needs no sowing. It is all harvest, and what is more the harvest is quickly turned into real money."

**THE DEPUTATION** from Simcoe and York counties which waited on the Government last week were told by Premier Borden that it is now too late to money an attempt to alleviate the fuel shortage. Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, Minister of Lands, Forests and Mines, announced that 1,000,000 cords of hardwood is available in a strip of land six miles wide along the railway running through Algonquin Park. He said the Government would give permission to the municipalities to cut the wood this coming summer, as one means of meeting the fuel shortage next winter.

**THE FEELING** so far expressed amongst the quarterly boards of the Methodist church in Canada appears to be in favor of the extension of the pastoral term, some by one, others two, while a few favor a larger extension.
