County Judge's Criminal Court

Amos Gardner, of Esquosing, committed for trial, as reported in the Champion last week, on the charge of stealing thirteen chickens from Geo. Mitchell, of Nassagaweya, at 8 a.m. on May 24th, was tried by Judge Elliot last Friday. The evidence for the prosecution was the same as that before the magistrate, already reported. For the defence Alex Livingstone, Gardner's employer, and his son, swore that on the night of the stealing Gardner was in bed at Mr Livingston's. His Honor, the Judge said the prisoner's innocence was clearly proved, and that there was no doubt that Mr Mitchell was deceived by the moonlight and was mistaken in his identification of Gardner. The prisoner was honorably discharged. It is supposed that the thief had come from a distance, in a vehicle, perhaps from a city. There have been many raids into the country by professional poultry thieves. Mr Mitchell said he thought the raider in this case had a flash light.
