ALGERIA'S WINE CROP YIELD

Product, Distinctly Inferior to That of Previous Season, With Total Only About 155,522,200 Gallons.

The wine crop of Algeria is distinctly inferior to that of a year ago. The official statistics of the vintage will not be issued for several weeks; but according to the general estimates the yield approximates 8,000,000 hectolitres (261,522,200 gallons), compared with 9,751,268 hectolitres (281,975,100 gallons) in 1916.

The season's unusual dryness, which lasted from spring until the full maturity of the grapes, states Commercial Reports, has resulted in a wine appreciably stronger. Phylloxera and other plant diseases did considerable damage to the vines, and the late gloom further tended to reduce the output.

Prices range much higher and the return to the wine producers promises to be good. Transportation facilities to France—which country takes a large percentage of the crop—are far from normal, and there is likely to be a marked shortage in barrels and bottles.

FEARS INCREASE OF DISEASE

New York Physician Sees More Affliction of the Thyroid Gland as Result of the War.

A marked increase in disease of the thyroid gland as a result of the war is predicted by Dr. E. F. Beebe of New York in the Medical Record. He bases this prediction on observations in Europe and on the fact that many of those who had suffered in the Kishineff massacre developed this disease after coming to New York; that their terrible experience in the Triangle Shirt Waist company's fire produced the same trouble in at least three of the sufferers and a similar effect was observed after the San Francisco earthquake.

For hyperthyroidism, as it is called, is known to be an effect of intense emotion, fright, distress, worry and mental and physical exhaustion. "The civil population will suffer from somewhat similar emotional disturbance," he continues. "The wives, sisters, sweethearts and mothers of the soldiers have had some foretaste of what is to come, and unless all previous experience is to be contradicted, the incidence of hyperthyroidism will be markedly increased."

Doctor Beebe says the sufferers will need special care, and the disease must be recognized and treated at once if the cure is not to be tediously long.
