Salukin, big chief of the Yakimas, with a number of other Indians, after protesting vainly to the local game wardens, went to the city to protest against the violation of their rights.

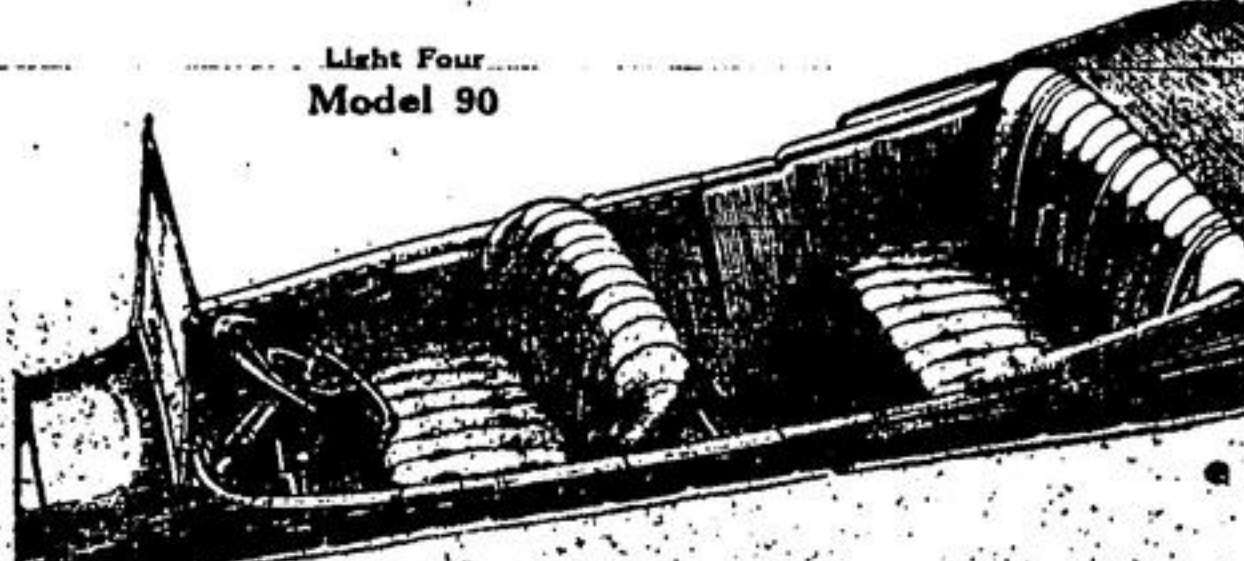

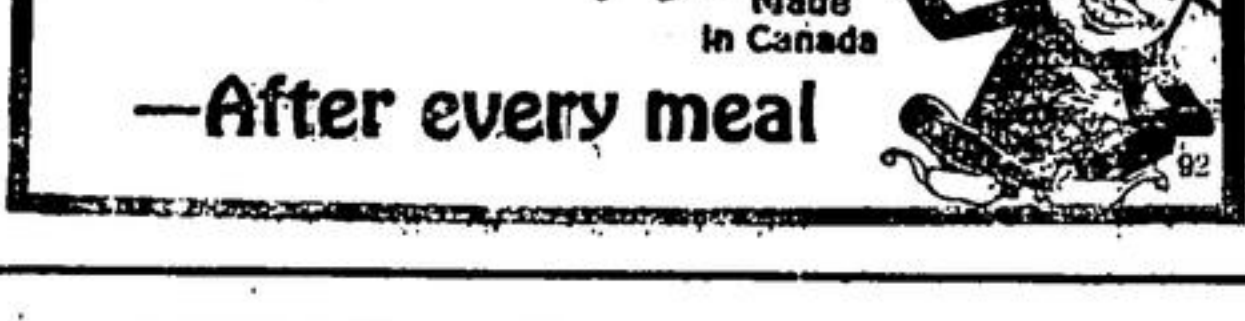
