Epidemics of Other Days

Cholera Eighty Years Ago—Immigrant Fever in 1847 was very bad.

The present outbreak of Spanish influenza is by far the most serious epidemic that has occurred in Canada within recent years. But the public have, on the whole, been far removed from any such epidemic since the year 1847. When it broke out, it made its appearance here, people were very alarmed, perhaps more so than they are today of Spanish influenza, though the fatalities resulted from it were not as serious.

Canada has experienced several outbreaks of cholera since the year 1847. The most serious of these was the outbreak of 1882, in the summer of which year there was a very heavy immigration from the British Isles. During the winter of 1881, cholera had caused several ravages in Great Britain. The British Government counselled that very careful preparations be made in Canada. Money was voted to insure full sanitary precautions.

Cholera—Grosse Isle, thirty miles below Quebec was established as a quarantine station, to which purpose it has been applied to this very day. Medical officers were appointed and temporary hospitals erected.

Nor were these preparations unneeded. On the 8th of June, 1882, news reached Quebec that a vessel from Dublin had arrived with 138 passengers, of whom no fewer than 59—nearly half of the total number—had died on the voyage. The following day, as though borne by the wind, or caused by the people's fear, fifteen attacks of cholera were reported at Quebec, of which seven proved fatal. The disease broke out in Montreal next day. Thence it passed to Kingston and Toronto and other towns in Upper Canada.
