Gasoline Ban Lifted

Removal of all restrictions on the retail sale of gasoline is announced by the fuel controller. Dealers may therefore continue to do business as in the past. An order-in-council has been passed on the fuel controller's recommendation entirely cancelling the present regulations. Dealers may now sell gasoline without license from the fuel controller and the fees already paid will be returned for the applicants. The repeal of the regulations in question also removes the restrictions regarding the sale of gasoline on Sunday.

Magistrates Heartwell and Near

Waller pleaded guilty to the theft of chickens; Harding will receive his sentence on Monday next. The Military Authorities took Walter to Brampton to be tried for desertion and forgery.
