FOR many years past, those who
have known India best have
recognized that one of her
greatest, if not her greatest
problem was that of education. It is,
of course, a problem recognized as
ever more important in many coun-
tries, but in India, where it is a mat-

000 people, all but six per cent. of
whom are still illiterate, the question
seems peculiarly vast. It is, moreover,
like everything else in India, a com-
plex question, and one that does not
lend itself to the simple rule of "have
method." To the education officials
of the Government, the purpose of the
decree, compulsory education, is
every thing in India. The up-to-date
report, however, says, "The
education of the Indian people is
not only a matter of national policy,
but also a matter of national pride."
