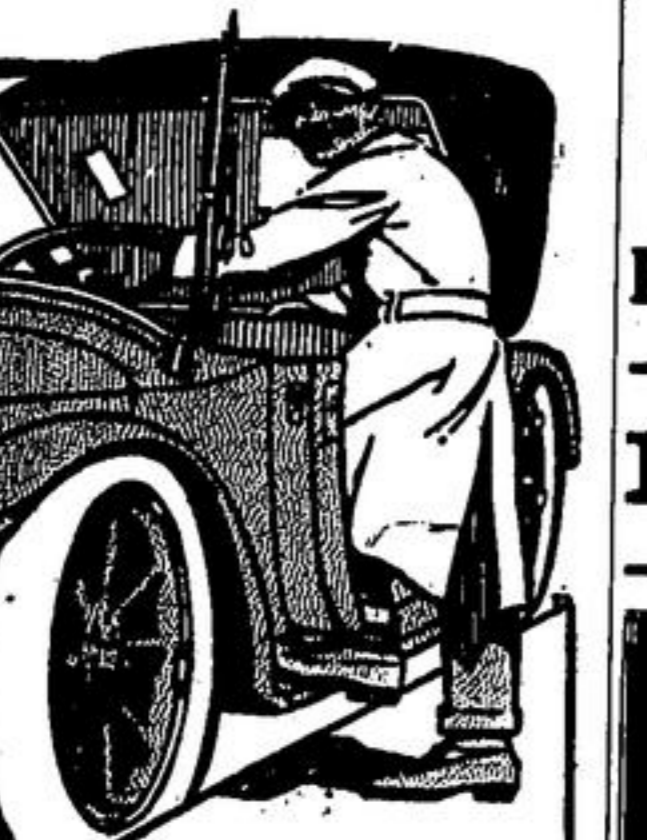

BY-LAW NO. 432

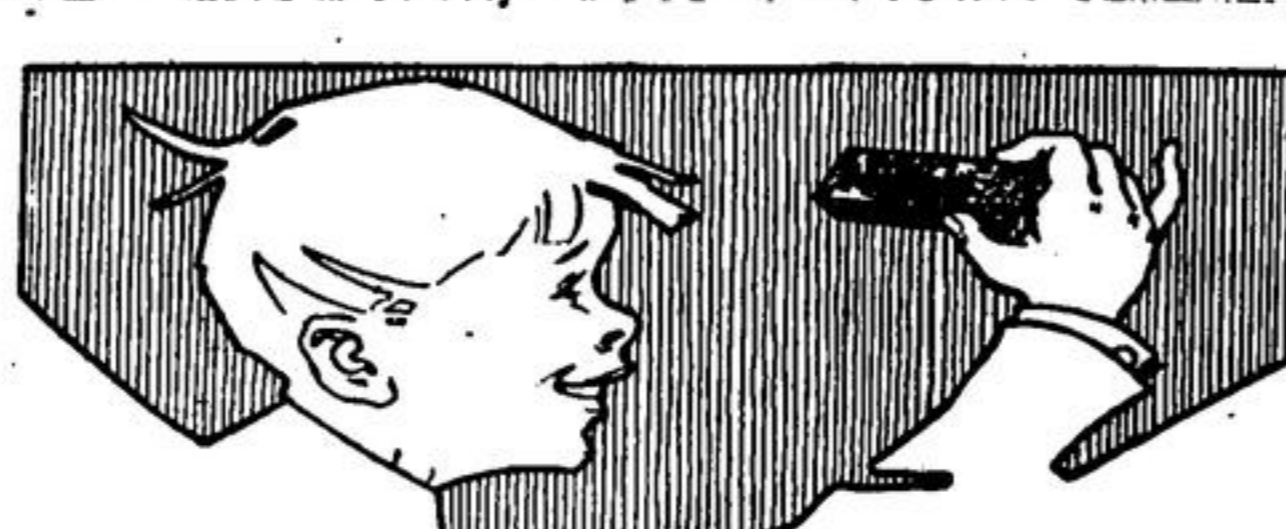
The Municipal Council of the Corporation of Georgetown hereby enacts as follows:
I The Provisions of the Ontario Housing Act 1919, shall apply to this Municipality.
II The head of the Council of this Municipality for the time being and E. McCannell and L. E. Fleck are hereby appointed a Commission to be known as "The Housing Commission of the Municipality of Georgetown," for the purpose of carrying out the Provisions of the said Act, and such Commission shall be a body Corporate.
III The said E. McCannell shall hold office for one year, and the said L. E. Fleck shall hold office for two years, and thereafter the members of the Commission other than the head of the Council shall hold office for two years.
IV Each appointed member of said Commission shall hold office until his successor is appointed.

Y. M. C. A. PLANS OVERSEAS

The Overseas section of the Canadian Y.M.C.A. has issued an official announcement of its plans. In laying out its military work for 1919 it was estimated that the Overseas work could be carried on without further appeal to Canada for funds, the necessary work remaining being made possible by utilizing canteen funds and balances of contributions, and by realizing on its assets in stocks and equipment.
The liquidation of these assets is now in progress, so far as the work permits, the decreasing numbers of Canadian Troops in France opening the way to a reduction in equipment, an expense of operation, and in stocks. As the number of Canadian troops in England is maintained by new arrivals from France the program there must be well continued.
It is right that every Canadian soldier should know that every dollar collected in Canada for Overseas, as well as every cent of profit from Overseas operations, such as the canteens, and the entire realization of assets Overseas will be spent in his service on this side of the Atlantic.
The Overseas Executive of the Y.M.C.A. figures that the funds obtained from these sources will permit the continuation of the Y.M.C.A. program until demobilization in France is complete, and in England until August 31st. Since by that date it seems certain that every Canadian will be on his way to Canada there is no prospect of even the last soldier from Overseas suffering from any serious curtailment of the Y.M.C.A. program.

No Right to Shoot

Last summer George Greiger, of Niagara Falls, Ont., raised Arthur Homan's orchard and took some pears. Homan fired at him with a shotgun and hit him in several places. Several grains of shot could not be extracted. Judge Livingston has awarded \$200 damages to Greiger on the ground that Homan had no right to shoot.

Money in Sweet Clover

There is money as well as honey, in sweet clover. One of the men in Markdale has sold eight carloads of sweet clover seed this year and on a recent Saturday, the farmers of the district purchased considerably over one hundred bushels. Mr. West Douglas, a farmer near Markdale, sold \$8,000 worth.
