Accused of Burning House
One day last week, says the Acton Free Press, Mr. Lorne Mullin, who lives on the Alex Sprawl farm, lot 18, on the second line, Equising, found that the frame house, which had been empty since last spring, was burning. He walked over to the house and found that Mrs. Sophia Cox and her son, Thomas, had moved in the Sunday previous without asking permission from any one. Mr. Mullin informed the Coxes he did not desire the house occupied as he intended to remove it to add to the buildings at the front of the farm, and requested that they vacate. On Saturday he found them still in the house and ordered them out. Some words followed and Tom is alleged to have said "We'll make hot for you for this." They commenced to remove their effects and Mr. Mullin went back to dinner. A little after one he returned to see if everything was safe, and to his consternation found the house all in flames. It was totally destroyed and it was with difficulty that Mr. Mullin and his neighbors were able to keep the fire from running into the bush and the adjoining grain fields. Upon the advice of Crown Attorney Dick, Cox was arrested and will be tried for burning the premises. Both Cox and his mother have been previously convicted of similar offences, the one for arson, breaking the other for burglary.

Hold-up in Oakville

Last Thursday morning about three o'clock, two men entered the Victory cafe, and after two drinks had taken their departure they proceeded to business. Producing a quantity of silver they asked the Chinese waiter, who was alone, the other members of the staff having retired, if he would give them bills in exchange. He went to the cash register and when he opened it one of the two placed a revolver to his stomach and demanded the contents of the till. They got away with about \$19, jumped into a car containing another man and woman, and made a rapid getaway toward Hamilton. That same night a Chinese restaurant in Toronto was robbed in a similar manner at 2 o'clock, Oakville at three o'clock, and another in Hamilton at four o'clock.

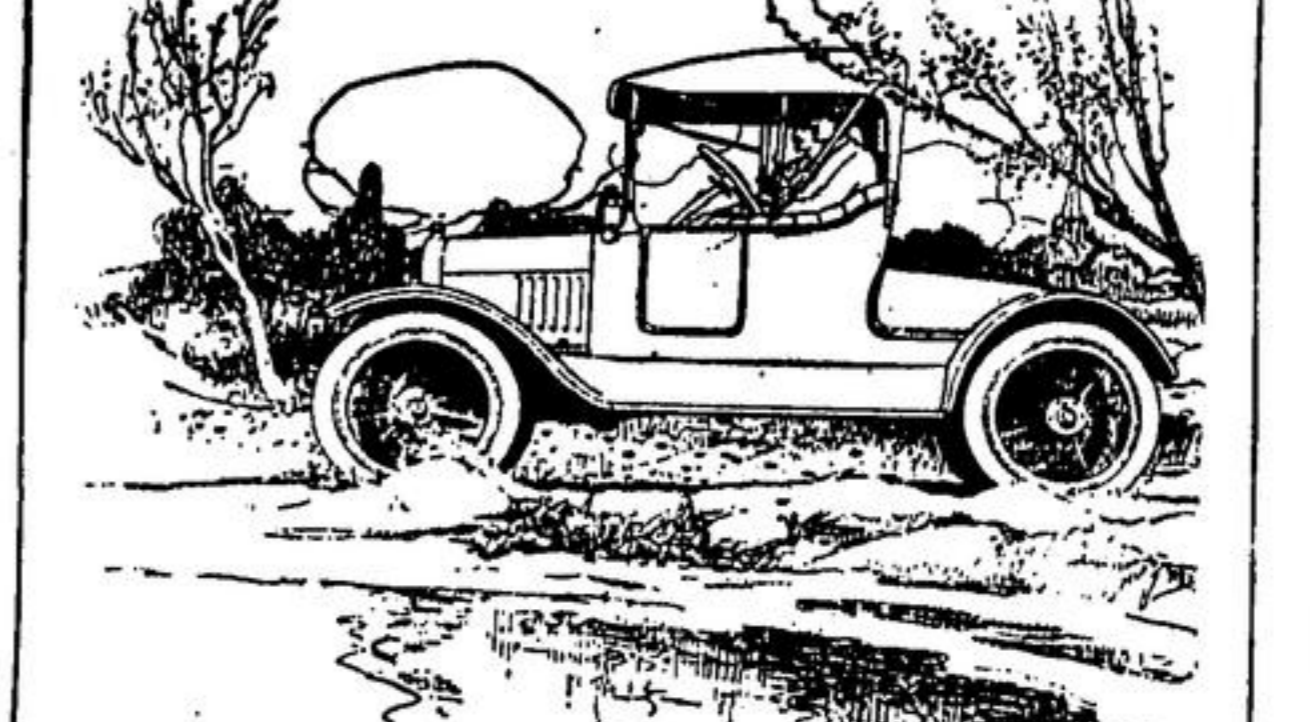
