H. S. ARRELL, Live Stock Commissioner, who has recently returned from a trip to Europe where he has reviewed the live stock market situation, has expressed his views, regarding Canada's position, in the October number of The Agricultural Gazette. He states that the London agents of our Canadian packers reviewed in disappointment the orders for Canadian goods—bacon, eggs, etc.—for which they could obtain but a tenth of the product they required. The unwarranted high price of hogs in Canada during the past month is but a reflection on the reputation of Canadian bacon, as compared with American, and demonstrates the effort of our packers to maintain their connection with old established clients in the face of short supplies. Since Denmark, within a year, will again be a factor on the bacon market our packers must be prepared for the future to fully production and such a substantial export supply as must command respect from the volume and quality. Short hog production is unquestionably the most dangerous policy Canada can adopt. This is true of eggs as well as hoon.

- The only SAFE course is to mark your ballot as shown above.

## Comradeship

ADmiral Sir David Beatty, when speaking at Leicester a few days ago, said: "We have been through four and a half years of a great struggle. We have all learned something—the true value of comradeship. Comradeship has enabled us to win the war." Samuel Gompers, the world's greatest labor leader, stated the workman's position, clearly when he said: "The normal man, the man of labor who works eight hours a day and no more, the workman who earns decent pay, the workman who lives comparatively comfortable homes, they do not want the artificial spirit. The man of normal spirit finds comfort in pleasant surroundings; he does not need, and, as a rule, does not partake of intoxicating drinks; he shuns the effects of intoxication. What we now ask is that the men of labor, the masses of our people, shall have the opportunity to drink a glass of beer of not more than 2 1/2% by weight of alcohol in that beer, and I am told you cannot drink enough of that character of beer to get drunk even if you tried."

Scientific tests, practical experiments and thorough research prove that beer of even greater strength than 2.5% of alcohol by weight, is absolutely non-intoxicating. (The results of these tests have been filed with the United States Circuit Court of Appeals). As no harmful results can possibly come from drinking beer of this quality—is there any fair or logical reason why the working man should not have the more palatable beer for which they are asking—THE BEER OF THE BALLOT?

Support the working men and the Citizens' Liberty League in the endeavor to obtain a fair, just and reasonable compromise on the present too drastic prohibitory legislation.
