County Court and General Sessions

The County Court and General Sessions opened before His Honour, Judge Elliot on Tuesday, December 10th. Two cases came up, one criminal and one civil.

John E. Hammerton, of Oakville, appeared for sentence. He pleaded guilty last July to stealing hives owned by G. E. Jackson of Toronto, for whom he was agent, and was remanded for sentence. As he had made restitution, been nine days in jail and the Judge ordered his release on suspended sentence.

Wilson vs Cockburn. Alex Wilson, of Milton, claimed damages from J. W. Cockburn & Son, of Guelph, contractors, for alleged breach of contract. Plaintiff claimed for defendants near Campbellville and quit work, alleging that defendants had failed to keep roads in suitable order. A number of witnesses were examined and the trial ended yesterday evening. Judgment reserved.

The trial of J. B. Clarkson, of Brantford did not come off. He had elected to be tried by a jury on the charge of driving a motor vehicle criminally and recklessly causing serious bodily harm to certain parties on the Toronto-Hamilton highway on September 5th. He changed his election to trial by Judge, without jury. He will be tried next Thursday.

BAPTIST


Christmas Sunday! Let us all go to church. Christmas Sermons by the pastor. Christmas music by the choir. Strangers and visitors always welcome.




