Hereford Cattle Sale at Guelph

Hogs Sold For 50c lb.
The auction sale of Hereford cattle under the auspices of the Ontario Hereford Breeders' Association held in the Winter Fair building at Guelph on December 12th, proved to be a very successful one. It was largely attended; good prices were obtained and the cattle were spread pretty well all over the Province. The top price of the sale paid by James Page, of Wallacetown, who paid \$1,400 for Ruby Fairfax, a two-year-old heifer, bred and consigned by J. Hooper and Sons, of St. Mary's. The price included a calf at foot, Ruby Fairfax, a yearling heifer from the herd of A. E. Clifton, of Bright brought \$1,000, the buyer being C. Lyons, of Dutton, W. Readhead of Milton paid \$800 for a five-year old cow. W. Mitchell of Norham, purchased a number of animals. The average price of the 87 animals sold was \$288. The grand total of the sale being \$17,855.
Hogs went under the hammer at prices which ranged from 91 to 93 cents per pound. The latter price was paid by J. R. Featherstone of Sherbrooke, for eight head which won a first stock. Featherstone's lot brought \$818 altogether, but further proof that it pays to breed good hogs, was afforded by the fact that Campbell Bros., of Sherbrooke, got 48 cents, or \$1,128, for a pen of ten hogs, and J. E. Brethour and Nephews of Burford, 49 1/2 cents or a total of \$1,089 for their lot of ten which won the farmers' special. The high price paid for hogs last year was 80 1/2 cents.
