

Dried Vegetable Value. It to by no means certain that dried regetables possess the same nutriment value as vegetables that have not been iried. Prof. Philip B. Hawk of Jefferson Medical college, Philadelphia, notes n Science a phenomenon that was sailed to his attention by Charles Denby of the war trade board and Daniel Moreau Barringer, which suggests that come hitherto unsuspected structural hange takes place in vegetables when

It is well known that when dried regetables are immersed in water for few hours they assure a form closey resembling that of fresh vegetables. Yet if this swollen vegetable be left at room temperature for from 24 to 88 nours it returns to its dried state, in ther words, a fresh vegetable holds ts water much more tenuclously than toes a dried vegetable that has been
