JUDGE MCGIBBON

Obituary

Atter an iliness of several weeks Duncan McGibbon, for apwards of 20 years Judge of the County Court of the County of Peel, passed away at his home here on Saturday last. He was 79 years of age. Born in Halton County in 1841, of Scotch parentage, he spent his boyhood days on the farm. After teaching school for a short time he took up the study of law and after being called to the Bar practised in bi home town of Milton until he was appointed to the Judgeship of Peel in 1894 following the death of the late Judge Scott. In 1871 he married Ann Pettitt, who preceeded him in 1901. He is survived by one son, Clare, of Hamilton, and one daughter, Miss McGibbon, at. home. Before his appointment to the bench the deceased took an'active, part in politice in Halton County. He was the statutch friend and supporter of Hon. David Henderson, who so long represent ed the County as a Conservative. He was a member of the Church of England. The funeral took place on Monday morning to St. Judge's Cemetery, Oakville, after a short service had been conducted by Rev. R. W. W. Allen, rector of Christ

He is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Duff, Milton, and two brothers, Archie, Governor of Milton goal, and John, of Esquesing.—Brampton Conservator.

Rooms Appreciated


The following words of appreciation were forwarded to us by the Secretary of the U.F.O. viz:-
