**Added Industry**

Herald readers will learn with much interest of the removal of Georgetown of the F. W. Corry Needle Company to Hamilton. Some two years ago rate payers sustained a by-law to assist two gentlemen from Paris to establish a last needle factory in town. However the bonds, then guaranteed by the town, were never used because local men provided the capital required, and proceeded with the factory, now the Canada Needle Works Limited. This business has become so successful that they have reached out and acquired the F. W. Corry Needle Co. and merged it with their present business.

Considerable extra help will be required at once as the Company have planned extensive additions. It is gratifying to know that about \$200,000 per year previously sent out of town by Messrs. Creelman Bros. and Harley-Kay Limited, for last needles is now put in circulation here at home for the benefit of property owners, merchants and the general welfare of all. Not only this but the further trade of many of Canada's best knitting mills and considerable American and other foreign business as well as helping to make our town more prosperous.—Com.
