Health Report for 1919

Following is the annual report of Medical Health Officer, Dr. Mo-Andrew for the village of Georgetown for the year 1919:-To the members of the Board of

Health, Georgetown; Gentlemen In submitting my annual report as Health Officer. I. am pleased to say that during the past year the sanitary conditions and the health of the town have been exceptionally, good. The number of communicable diseases reported has been fewer than usual there have been no deaths from such and at any time during the indicate an epideniic. This condition I consider is largely due not only to the fact that the quarantine in each and every case has boen strictly observed, but also to the watchfulness exercised by both parents and teachers over the children for these infections and contagious diseases. I may say that the teachers are always on the alert and any suspicious cases are at once sent from school to me as Health Officer, for examination or to their homes for examination

by their family physician. The following diseases were reported-diphtheria 8 cases, scarlet fever 15, smallpox 2, whooping cough 6, chicken pox 4, Scabes 4. Impetigo contagiosum 7. With regard to the diphtheria two of the cases were contracted in Toronto while Hamilton favoured us with the third. These cases were strictly quarantined, negative throat results obtained and the premises thoroughly fumigated before they were released with the result that no other cases developed. Most of the scarlet fever cases were in April and May and the source of the infection of the first patients was also of outside origin. I visited the homes of all these cases as soon as they were reported, to ascertain and Harry Wood) equal, Gladye the measures and precautions that were taken against the further

spread of the infection. We have been-most fortunate in having but two cases of smallpox, both, children, and as with the scarlet fever and diphtheria, this infection came from outside in the first case and from subsequent exposure here in the second, although loughby, John Armstrong, Elva the patients were of different families I confined them in the same house, vaccinated all persons exposed and continued the quarantine until absolutely sure all danger was past. With regards the safety of the other children of the town. I recommended in the local paper that they be vaccinated and an opportunity for three days for free vaccination was given; as a result most of the children were vaccinated and I am sure this has no doubt been the means of the absence of further cases in town. The other communicable diseases reported were similarly dealt with

with satisfactory results. With regards to the sapitary conditions of the town, we have had all kinds of complaints, real and groundless, to deal with from time to time, and as far as possible these were looked into at once by the sanitary inspector or myself and abated. The thorough spring "clean-up," the improvements and tidiness in homes and premises, the paving of Main street, the better watering of the streets, the cutting of weeds, etc., all of which certainly contribute to the town's good health is worthy of mention. However the two things most urgently needed at the present time are more houses and more water. Regarding the increased water supply during the summer, we had an engineer from the Provincial Board of Health look into every possible source of supply, ascertain the quantity and the quality of the various springs and ad-
