On Wednesday afternoon last, the members of the Mission Band of Norval Presbyterian Church, accompanied by a number of friends met at the home of Mrs. Noble to say good-bye to their much esteemed president, Mrs. Ferguson, who is leaving with Mr. Ferguson for their new field of work near Seaford. Mrs. Ferguson worked untiringly in the interest of the young people of the community, during her sojourn in Norval, and her work in the Mission Band particularly has been very encouraging and helpful. A very enjoyable social time was spent. Mrs. Ferguson was presented with a beautiful chair and the following address, by the Mission Band:
