Major W. D. Sharp of Guelph has been awarded the Cross of Mercy for war services in Serbia. This decoration is conferred by King Peter, through the Crown Prince Alexander, Regent of Serbia.

The Dr. was notified by Major Sharp that he had been born in the Serbia Council at Montenegro. Major Sharp was with the B.N.M.S. and in 1915 was attached to Belgrade military hospital.

In the retreat from Belgrade, he was one of the last to leave the hospital.

County Town Statistics.

According to the assessment roll just returned the statistics of Milton are as follows:—The total assessment is \$771,041. Last year's assessment was \$865,025. The increase, with reduced expenditure, will mean a decreased tax rate. The population is a trifle over 1800. Last year's was 1700. Progress is being made towards the figure of a new year's ago, over 2000. This year there are 415 children between the ages of 5 and 81 and 405 between those of 5 and 16.

Hard on Dealers.

Sometime ago a spotter visited Milton. He bought an un stamped package of Dr. Hess' Poultry Panaceas at Blair &amp; Hapton's flour and feed store and one of the same maker's soap care at Clements &amp; Co.'s hardware store. On Tuesday he brought the dealers before Police Magistrate Dice, charged with a violation of the War Stamp Act. Both pleaded guilty and declared that they had not known that the affixing of the stamp was required. In both cases the minimum fine, \$50, was imposed by the magistrate. No doubt about it the dealers violated the law when they did not pay the fine in the circumstances—it was a hardship. While ignorance is no defense for a violation of the law, that is not fully explained to those to whom it applies because it comes a trap. Goods which require stamps should be listed and manufacturers should be required to affix the stamp. As the law stands it discriminates in their favor and against the retailer-champion.
