Some More About Georgetown in the Good Old Days.

Mr. Editor:

I have just finished reading Mr. Charles Young's descriptive account entitled "Historical Sketch of Georgetown," and to an old timer it was very interesting. A unique event in Mr. Young's history is the fact that Georgetown has not been mentioned. When the U.T.R. was being constructed, the route between the villages of Georgetown and Acton. Between building bridges, rock was piled up in a mine. A great quantity of money was sunk. A great army of men were employed, who got their pay on the 15th of every month. Mr. James A. Kennerly was there. There were no banks in Georgetown at that time. Mr. Young was obliged to drive to Toronto every month for the cash. On Dundas Street between Toronto and the Mumber, there was a great block of money, and on one of Mr. Young's trips, a couple of fellows of the Jesse James' type sprang out and grabbed the money by the handful. The money was taken to the bank. With great presence of mind he exclaimed: "He is just here. Put the money in the bank." He concluded he was better off by four thousand dollars. The reader will notice that the account of Mr. Young's answer, but he would be more than human to allow a couple of thugs to go through his pockets to the tune of \$1,000.00 in gold coins. There was a great wrestler in those days in Georgetown, who went by the name of "The Hercules." He was the antagonist with the greatest of ease and would send him feeling upwards of thirty feet in the air. I believe he holds the record up to the present time and was the cause of many a Doonbrook in those days. The reader will ask what his other name was. When Georgetown was but a hamlet the name of "The Hercules" was a conspicuous figure. He was grand father to Mr. J. W. Kennedy and was a fine specimen of a man. Firemen at Welland

Found Dead in Buggy

David Cunningham, a young man 23 years of age, son of Mr. James Cunningham, of Spryngue, met death in a mysterious manner on Sunday, August 8th, the circumstances concerning which are at the present time being investigated. It seems that the young man left home about 2 o'clock on Sunday afternoon during heavy rain and fog, but did not inform anyone where he was going, and at 10 o'clock the same night he was discovered by Mr. Gordon, who keeps the store at Spryngue, and Joseph Stewart, in the buggy in front of the store dead. The remains were at first in the buggy by a small bolt, which caught in the clothing, thus preventing it from falling out. He had evidently seen death but a very short time, as the body was still quite warm.

Dr. Angus Mackinnon, of Guelph, Ontario, was at once notified and drove out to the scene. After making a thorough examination of the body he found that death must have been due to natural causes, as there were no signs of violence on the body anywhere.
