A meeting was held in the council chamber Monday night at 8 o'clock, at which the mayor presided. Lieut. H. G. Jackson briefly outlined the need for funds to carry on the work of the Navy League as follows:

- 1—Education of the people in the importance of building up a merchant fleet manned by Canadians.
- 2—To train boys for the sea, already the League has 2000 boys trained and 80 qualified and on merchant ships.
- 3—The upkeep of sailors homes and Institutes to make Jack's life when ashore more comfortable.
- 4—Lastly but not least, the relief of dependents of the Merchant Marine who went under during the great war. These men died, but we live and should see to it that the dependents do not want. Georgetown has always nobly responded when help was needed and in the plea for the sailor, the following committee was formed to secure workers to gather in funds locally on the anniversary of Trafalgar Day, Thursday, Oct. 21st, when all towns will be similarly helping.

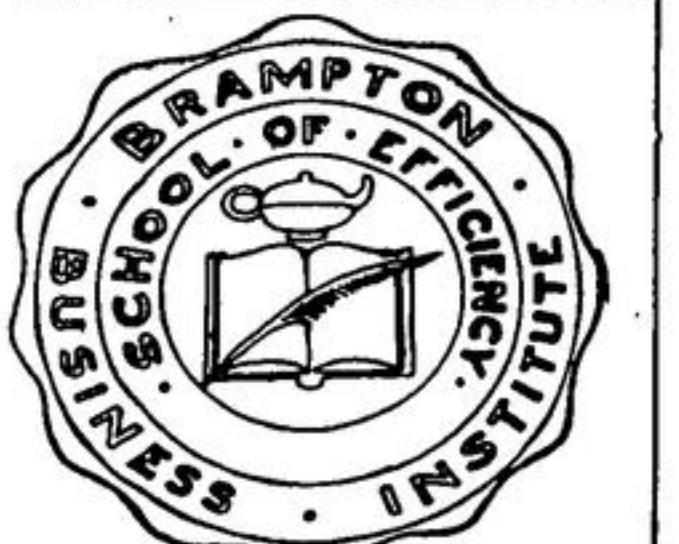
