**Found Dead in Stable**  
Charles McNally Trampled to Death by Horse  
Mr. Charles McNally, who worked for Mr. Hugh Logan, was found dead in the latter's stable on Monday morning last, about 7:30 by two of Mr. Logan's sons. Deceased had left the house about 9:30 and had not been seen afterward until found as stated above. His body was terribly broken and bent and was lying in the stall between one of the heavy horses when he was found. It is supposed he was trampled by the horse and then when conscious trampled to death.  
Coroner McClellan was summoned and an inquest ordered. A jury was sworn on Monday evening with Mr. R. H. Stull foreman, and after viewing the remains adjourned to meet at the coroner's hall, Glenwilliams, on the 20th, at 2 p.m.  
The deceased was buried in the 20th St. Cemetery, Georgetown this afternoon.

**Induction Service**  
A very impressive service was performed by the Ven. Archdeacon MacKiutoch of Guelph, when the Rev. Percival Mayes was inducted as Rector of St. George's Church. A full choir was in attendance. Mrs. Bradley being at the organ.  
Others taking part in the service were the Very Rev. D. T. Owens, Dean of Niagara, Rev. C. H. Buckland M.P.P. and the Rev. F. J. Scoville of St. George's Church, Guelph. Other Clergy present were Rev. E. J. Mannell, Acton, Rev. E. A. Stuck of St. Patrick's, Guelph, and Rev. E. O. Twiss, Norval.  
The sermon was preached by the Very Rev. D. T. Owens, and was a very able discourse on the text, "In the beginning God." Gen. I. 1st verse. God as the background of all individual and provincial activities. God as eternal the same for ever without beginning and ending. God as Love, and because he loves is interested in every detail of Parish work. The preacher made a plea for a wider vision of the work of the ministry and more study of prayer, co-operation of the people essential to a successful ministry.  
After the service a reception was held in the schoolroom. A large number being present. Refreshments were served by the Ladies of the congregation. Officials and members of St. Alban's Church were present, as well as the Rev. R. F. Cameron and Major Grant of Knox Church, and members of other churches.

**Haltontown Rifles**  
Recruiting for the newly re-organized "Haltontown Rifles" will commence at once. One active Battalion (78th) and two reserve Battalions (78th and 194th) have been authorized. All three units will perpetuate and keep alive the splendid war records of the Battalions after which they are named. The new regiment boasts two sets of colors already in the hands of Georgetown, and the 194th in Oakville, and an effort will be made to obtain the 87th Batt. colors which are not in the district at present.  
The commanding officer, Lt. Col. J. Ballantine D.S.O., will choose his officers from men, but officers and N.C.O.'s with overseas records, and where possible from residents of the county of Halton. N.C.O.'s will at least hold their former rank in the new unit.  
Recruits are required to sign up for three years and to attend camp or get leave of absence when unable to attend.  
New equipment will be provided in the near future including uniforms for the band, which will be formed early in the New Year. The armories in the county will be repaired. An officer from Headquarters visited Georgetown last week and has requisitioned for numerous improvements to the local armory including a new floor. The armory will be available for athletic purposes for the members of the regiment as well as for civilians. Already a large number of returned men have applied for enlistment in the Regiment and there should be no trouble in getting a full complement of men for

Co., which will be recruited in Georgetown, Acton and township of Esquesing, and will be commanded by Lieut. H. M. Kennedy, who will be promoted to the rank of Major.  
One platoon will be set apart for recruits who have had no previous military training.  
The advantages of joining the new unit are many. Here are a few of them:  
I The annual camp will be an ideal place for returned men to meet and associate with comrades of former days.  
II A modern military camp where the comfort and recreation of the men is a first consideration, is a splendid place to spend an annual vacation, with all expenses paid on full pay.  
III Returned men should all join a militia unit so as to have their war records kept for all time and also to be certain of receiving all war medals and engagements which they are entitled to and which will be more easily obtained through a militia unit than by the individual himself.  
IV All red-blooded men with their country's welfare at heart should have at least an elementary military training.  
Officers of the Regiment will be at the G.W.V.A. rooms on Tuesday evening, Dec. 21st, to sign up recruits.
