

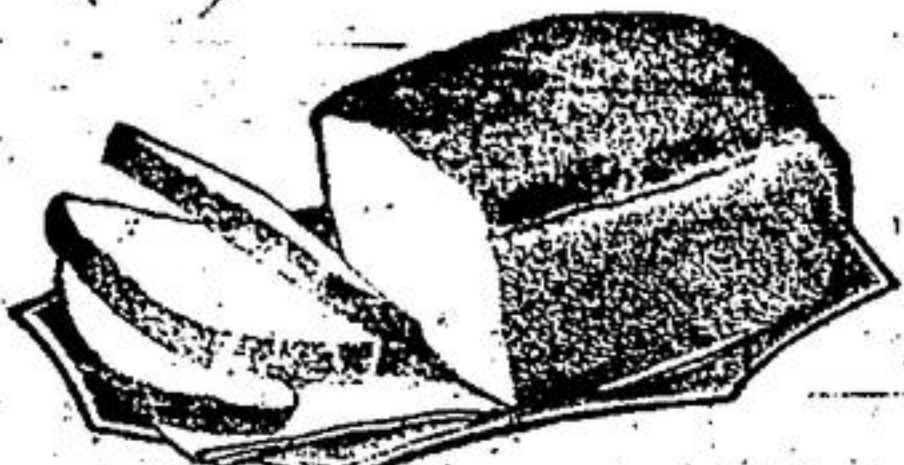
A WONDERFUL WORLD

 No homewife in America is so independent of the price of coal and oil as the habitant woman of Quebec, with an out-of-door brick oven at her beck and call. These roadside-ovens, — and nobody knows exactly what whim possessed the Quebecer for carrying his baking apparatus so far from home, unless it was fear of the roaring fire which would be set up in order to bake the large quantity of bread necessary to fill the many mouths of the grande famille, — are not only landmarks in Quebec but indications of the habitant housewife's hospitality. They seem to say to the passer-by, "Now you know you are in Quebec, and Quebec is the land of home-made bread." Mails out, "Entrez vous. For a mere song Madame will cut you some thick slices and bring out a pitcher of milk." Oul, the grand oven is undoubtedly the symbol of Quebec. There is a friendly look about these old roadside ovens which arises out of the fact that they are made by hand and fit in perfectly with the landscape and the scheme of life in general.
