Parcel Post Rates
 An increase in parcel post rates to Great Britain from Canada became effective July 1st. The increase is from 15 to 20 cents on a parcel weighing one pound, with a gradually increasing rate to the maximum of 11 pounds, which will be \$1.80, as compared with \$1.52 at present. The new rates will be 20 cents for the first pound and 16 cents for each succeeding pound or fraction thereof. The rates taken given are as follows: 1 lb., 20 cents; 2 pounds, 36 cents; 3 pounds, 52 cents; 4 pounds, 68 cents; 5 pounds, 84 cents; 6 lbs., \$1.00; 7 pounds, \$1.16; 8 pounds, \$1.32; 9 pounds, \$1.48; 10 pounds, \$1.64; 11 pounds \$1.80.

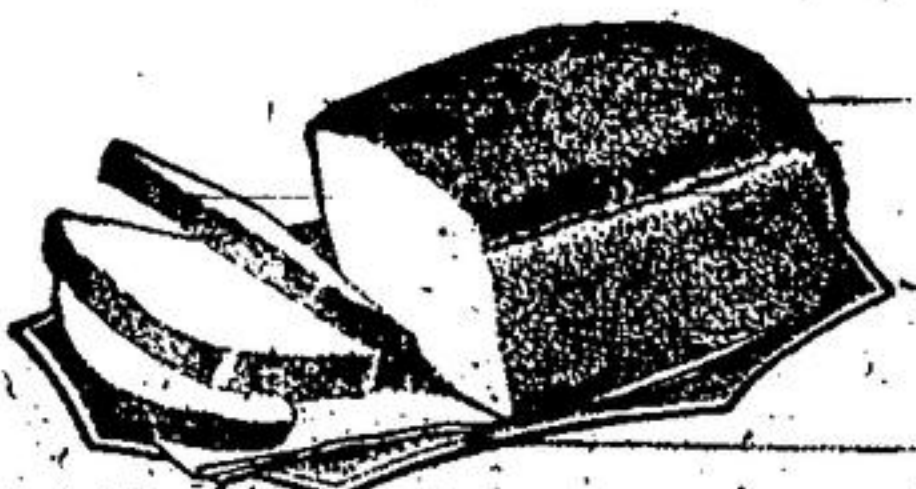
R. J. Guthrie Deceased.
 An obituary from the Toronto Globe of July 21st, refers to a former Georgetown boy, whose death is deeply regretted by many former school mates and associates. Another drowning, fatal to the third in three weeks, occurred at Wassaic Beach this afternoon, when Bobb J. Guthrie, a leading citizen of Barrie, lost his life. With a friend, he went out on the river after dinner to fish, and when near the mouth of the river the waves driven in from the bay by a strong wind overturned the boat. His companion clung to the shore, but Mr. Guthrie who was a good swimmer, struck out for shore which was barely 80 ft. away. After he had taken only a few strokes he went down and did not reappear. Nearly two hours later his body was recovered in 16 ft. of water. Mr. Guthrie was had been on the staff at Allandale for about twenty years. He was a Presbyterian, being an elder in St. Andrew's Church. His wife and one daughter survive.

Forest Fires Kill Jobs

HERE are instances of carelessness such as the Fire Rangers of Ontario are meeting all the time. Each is an actual case, as officially reported in detail to the Forestry Branch. Until each individual realizes personal responsibility and co-operates to prevent forest fires, Government Fire Rangers can hope merely to lessen the tragic consequences of such human carelessness and bad judgment.

Save Ontario's Forests They're Yours

Lumbermen's Fires
 May 25th, 1920—A careless driver, leaving his engine, fire or throwing a cigarette into a stack, burned over two townships, including 7,000,000 feet of pine, a 16,000 acre camp, buildings and equipment worth \$7,000, sawn lumber worth \$7,500, and killed several million young spruce and jack pine trees.

May 25, 1920—Fire in a rabbit heap behind a lumber company's boarding house got away and, despite prompt action, burned 1,200 acres, including 2,000,000 feet of white pine, and a set of new camps worth \$1,000.

June 1, 1920—Two men were to be paid for the top logs in a dam, but they got away from either their smudge or camp fire, and burned over 9,000 acres, including 6,000,000 feet of white pine, four camps, large quantities of supplies, and equipment, to a total value of \$44,000.

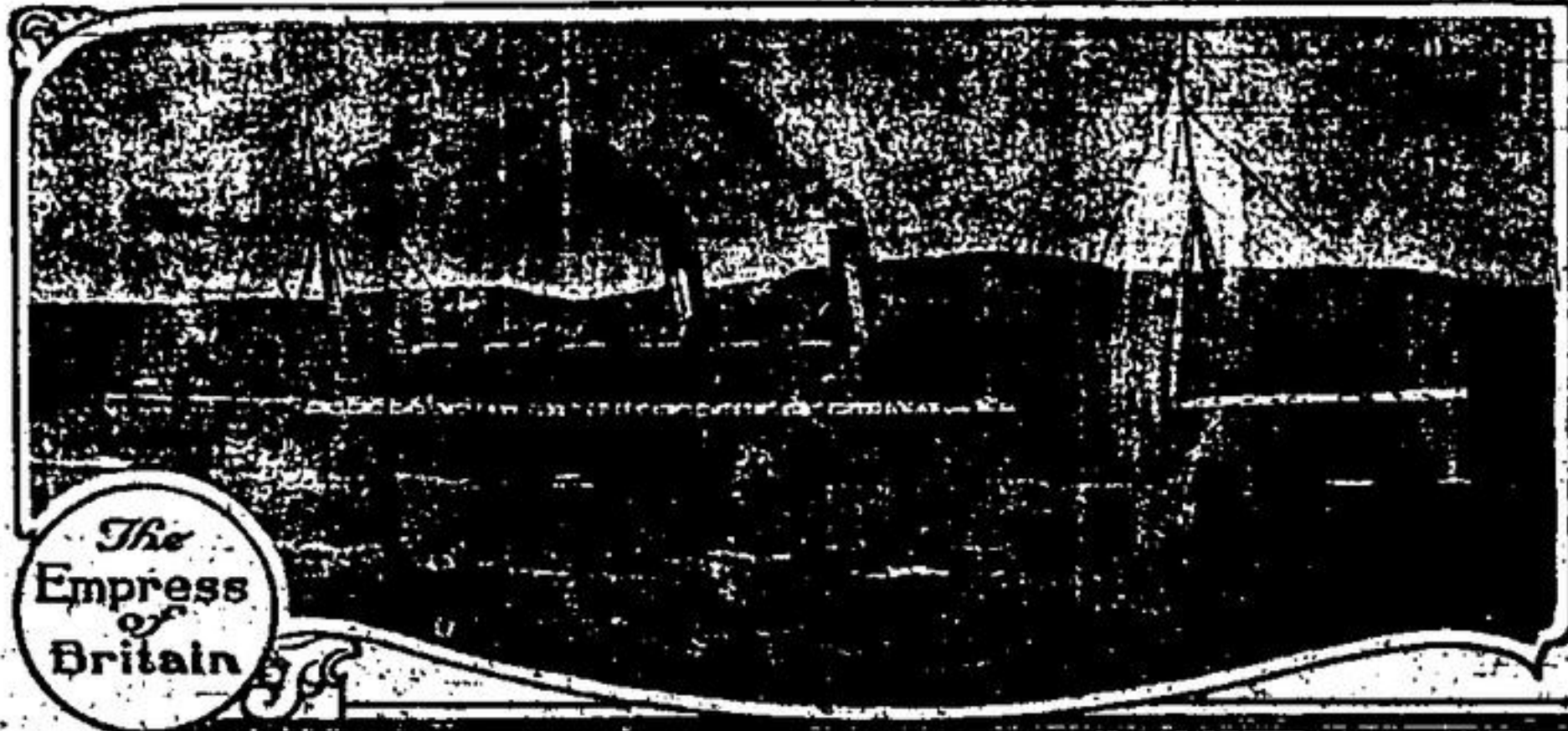
May 24th, 1921—Lumbermen burning slash around their camps, lost control of their fire and 15,000 acres were burned before they regained it.

Railway Fires
 June 26th, 1920—Engine No. 1163 started a forest fire which ran over 15,000 acres, burning one saw mill, three sets of lumber camps, shacks, houses, and outcrops, 5,000 cut logs and 1,400 piles, besides standing timber.

Montreal as an Immigration Centre



The Empress of Britain, one of the big Immigrant Lines of the Atlantic on the St. Lawrence Route. On her last voyage she brought 800 settlers to Canada, most of them bound for the West.

Montreal is one of Canada's chief immigration centres. While the chief ports of disembarkation are Halifax and St. John in winter and Quebec in summer, a large proportion of the total arrivals reaches Montreal on their way west or for redistribution, while many stay off at that city in order to settle in Quebec province.

Evidence of its being a busy immigration centre is seen at the wharves as well as the railway stations. Come with me to the Canadian Pacific Ocean Service dock—Montreal has just come in at an hour when the city is busy as usual. Soon after the big Leviathan ties up at the wharf—and remember that she sailed for a river for eight hundred miles from the open sea—all its bustle and excitement for the docking of a transatlantic vessel is always an imposing sight. Gang-planks are lowered, donkey engines chime their noisy song, and what the endless number of trunks from the deep-holds, and the passengers land once again on solid mother earth.

Among the hundreds of passengers are scores who may be regarded as newcomers and—prospective settlers in a new land, the third-class passengers having left the ship at Quebec. And among the Montreal arrivals are many who belong to the class of household workers for whom Canadian homes are waiting. As they have helped while on board by a C. P. E. trainee, so on land there are immigration officials of both sexes; and port chaplains—the Roman Catholic Church, the W. C. A. secretaries, Jewish missionaries and many another ready to render help. The services these voluntary workers give is of the highest value and is greatly appreciated.

With baggage and luggage arranged alphabetically in the long freight shed, it is an easy matter to identify and check the mountains of trunks and bags as they are piled high in the transport wagons for the railway station.

Next let us go to the Windsor Street Station of the Canadian Pacific Railway. It is always a busy centre, but after the arrival of several ocean boats it is doubly so, and yet such is the excellent system in vogue that there is no confusion. No one can go astray while finding the right train. The workers on finds at the docks are here to assist for they know no union hours. Twenty at a stretch is not unusual under pressure for there is a myriad of services to be given, and given quickly.

Before we see off the trainloads of immigrants it will be worth while visiting the wonderful facilities offered these newcomers in this one station and by railway company. Under the Concourse, there are large rooms, well equipped for the use of the immigrant who may need to re-
