Killed at Geoph O.A.C.
Death came suddenly to Gordon Orwash at Geoph O.A.C. last Saturday morning while unloading a car of stone. The shunting of another car had started the car on which the unfortunate young man was working and he was in some way thrown beneath the wheels. No one actually saw the accident, but his lifeless and badly mutilated remains were discovered by a workman lying across the track with his head almost underneath the car. Examination revealed the fact that wheels of the car must have passed over Gordon's chest, for the belt of his overalls was around the wheel at one end of the car while his body was almost under the wheel at the other end. Both arms were almost completely severed, and his chest was badly cut. Deceased lived in Georgetown for a number of years when a lad and was well known here.

Daughter of Pioneer Dead
Mrs. J. McFarlane, whose mother, Catherine Triller, was the first white woman married in the county of Halton, died at the age of 95 on Saturday, in Buffalo, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. M. W. Ford, of Union Empire Loyalist stock. Her grandparents took up several hundred acres of land between Bronte and Burlington in 1798. The Toronto-Hamilton Highway passes through the original holding, her husband predeceased her 40 years ago.

Veterans at Exhibition

All veterans, irrespective of rank, former service, members of an organization or not will mobilize at Trinity College Grounds not later than 12.30 p. m. The parade will march off not later than 1.15 p. m. Late arrivals must not break into companies already formed. Provision has been made to form new companies as necessary. Bandmen, nursing sisters and like naval veterans will parade in uniform. All other ranks will wear ordinary street attire, with service buttons, and authorized war medals, or if not in possession of all the latter, will put up the ribbons to which they are entitled.
