## Does This Mean You?

If you are a woman and a British subject, you may vote at the coming election providing you have lived in Canada a year and in the riding for two months. If your husband is a British subject, you are a British subject, no matter where you were born.

But if you were not born in North America, you must go to the judge and obtain a voting certificate before your name is placed on the voters' list.

If you were born in the British Empire and are unmarried, you may vote without the judge's certificate.

If you were born in the Empire and are married to an alien, you are also an alien and cannot vote.

If you were born in Europe and married to a British subject, or if your husband became naturalized after you married him, you are also a British subject—and may vote, but you must obtain the judge's certificate before your name goes on the list.

If you were born in the States or anywhere else in North America and are married to a British subject, you may vote without a judge's certificate. It makes no difference whether you were born in North America or some other country.

There are several exceptions. If your father was naturalized before you were 21, you need not have the certificate, no matter where you were born.

If you had the right to vote in 1917 (that is, if you had a son, a brother or father or husband in the war at that time) you do not need the certificate no matter where you were born.

All judges have been supplied with the blank voting certificates. Get your certificate now if you need it, before election day is too near at hand.

## Nassagaweya Tw'p. Memorial Unveiled

More than a thousand people from all parts of Halton county attended the unveiling of the handsome memorial monument erected by the citizens of Nassagaweya township to the memory of its heroes who fell in the great war. The ceremony began at 10 o'clock on the afternoon of Thanksgiving Day, the monument being unveiled by Capt. Mahon of Campbellville, assisted by Rev. Mr. Lowe, also of Campbellville. An adjournment was then made to the Presbyterian Church, where patriotic addresses were delivered by Capt. Mahon, Rev. Mr. Lowe, and Mr. J. J. G. Little of Guelph; D. B. Hutcheon, Rev. of Nassagaweya, and Revs. Messrs. J. T. Strachan, Nassagaweya; Lowe, Campbellville; Arthur Moffat, Blair, Guelph and Carroll of Nassagaweya; Duncan Campbell of Moffat was Chairman, and Capt. W. F. Dewar of Milton sounded the last Post. Ninety-eight young men from the township were the call to arms, and 22 made the supreme sacrifice. The handsome monument, costing \$4,000, with the names of the dead inscribed on its stands on the corner of County Treasurer Hutchinson's farm on the Guelph road, ten miles west of Milton.

## County Council

Milton, Nov. 8th, 1921.

Mr. Blain moved, seconded by Mr. Hutcheon, that the sum of \$200 be granted to the Children's Aid Society of Peel and Halton, the same to be made payable to C. H. Stuart, Treasurer, Carleton Place.

Mr. Hampshire moved, seconded by Mr. Irving, that leave be granted to introduce a by-law to authorize the borrowing of money to meet certain ordinary expenses for the year.—Carried.
